### Overseas Mailing Data Announced By Local Office

The Postmaster has announced that the following periods have been designated for mailing parcels to members of the Armed Forces overseas.

Oct. 16 to Nov. 11 — surface transportation.

Oct. 21 to Dec. 1 — Space available (SAM).

Dec. 1 to Dec. 11 — airmail.

By mailing during one of these designated times it will assure the serviceman of getting his parcel in time for Christmas, the postmaster said.

The term "Armed Forces Overseas" includes personnel of the Armed Forces, members of their families, and U.S. Civilians employed overseas who receive their mail through an APO or FPO New York, San Francisco, or Seattle.

All articles for overseas mailing should be packed in boxes of wood, metal, solid fiberboard, or strong double faced corrugated fiberboard. All fiberboard boxes should be securely wrapped in heavy paper which strengthens the package. Each box should be well tied with strong cord. Suf-

## College Enrollment Is Up 6.8%, Report Show

Cisco Junior College enrollment has an increase of 6.8 percent over the 1966 fall enrollment, according to a report from the Coordinating Board of the Texas College and University System.

CJC has 895 enrolled for the fall semester, compared with 838 enrolled for the 1966 fall semester. This count does not include the nursing program in Graham and Cisee which would put the total well over 900, according to CJC President Leland Willis.

The largest increases were the junior colleges opening for the first time and those in their second year of operation. Thirteen junior colleges had decreased in enrollment.

A total of 76,007 students are enrolled in public junior

colleges in Texas, compared with 62,638 enrolled last year for an increase of 21.3 percent.

## Sabanno Watershed Survey To Evaluate Area This Month

A preliminary field examination is scheduled to be made on the Sabanno River Watershed during the period of Oct. 23-27 according to Ross Wilson, Chairman of the Watershed Association. Wilson stated that this action is coming as a result of the association's application filed with the U. S. Department of Agriculture last February for project approval. The examination will be

made by economists and engineers representing the Soil Conservation Service and the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board. The purpose of the examination is to secure information on Watershed problems, the needs and desires of the local people for protective measures, and to determine the feasibility for project type development as well as the willingness and ability of the spon-

sors to carry out their responsibilities. Sponsors lending support to the Association on the project are the Eastland and Comanche County Courts, Upper Leon Soil and Water Conservation District, and Lower Clear Fork Soil and Water Conservation District.

## Pecan Crop Due To Be Good For Texas, Nation

The 1967 pecan crop for Texas and the nation is expected to be above the yield for last year but slightly below the average, according to figures released last week by the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Texas Department of Agriculture.

The report estimated that the Texas crop will be 35 million pounds — 35 per cent more than last year. The national yield was estimated at 213.4 million pounds, 32 per cent above the 1966 crop but six per cent below the average.

Early varieties began splitting shucks in late September in many areas — somewhat earlier than normal. By early October, harvest was getting underway.

Good crops are expected in the Cross Timbers, San Saba area of the Edwards Plateau, and portions of the Blacklands along the Red River.

Market prices are good at this time, it was reported.
