"He sustained a fragmental wound to the head from a hostile artillery round while in a defensive position. His condition and prognosis were excellent. He was treated in the field and returned to duty.

Also, that there was no candy or ice there and that the only news the boys there received was in the form of personal mail.

### County Bond Sale Tops \$15,000

Mr. Guy P. Parker, Chairman of the Eastland County Savings Bonds Committee announced today that sales in Eastland County totaled \$15,000 during the month of August. Sales for the first eight months of 1967 totaled \$139,342 and this is 88 per cent of the 1967 goal of \$370,000.

Series E & H Savings Bond and Freedom Share sales in Texas during August totaled \$15,063,163 which is an increase of 8.3 per cent over the same period last year. Sales for the first eight months totaled \$111,942,171 and this is 62 per cent of the 1967 sales goal of \$181.3 million.

Nationally, new purchases of E & H Savings Bonds during August amounted to \$392 million which is 1.3 per cent over the \$387 million a year ago. The January-August sales totaled \$3,420 million; 3 per cent above sales last year and an 11-year peak for eight months' sales.

## Gorman Peanut Tour Conducted

A tour of five Gorman area peanut farms was conducted Thursday morning by De Gordon, Eastland County agricultural agent. The tour began at 9 a. m. with the Wallace peanut digger demonstration on the D. D. Warren farm.

Next stop was at the Claude Fuller farm for a check of irrigated peanuts. Fuller has harvested an early crop of peanuts with 60-bushel-per-acre yield, which is below the 1966 average but still a good yield.

Irrigated peanuts were also checked at the Gene Snyder farm north of Gorman. He harvested nine acres that produced 129 bushels per acre with a grade of 73.

Results of Di Sypson for thrip control were checked at the Durwood Burgess farm. Last on the Gorman tour was the J. O. Jackson farm west of Gorman.

These peanuts have been treated with Terroclor for control of southern blight.

The peanuts were in the process of being dug and complete results will not be known until the peanuts are harvested.

They also toured the George Seale farm, for irrigation; Hulon Irvin, for different varieties; T. J. Beggs, dry land peanuts; Edwin Cheaffier, leaf spot control demonstration; and Kenneth Bostick farm, irrigated peanuts, all of Rising Star.

### Tidelands Case Is Coming To Forefront Again

Texas Tidelands litigation is coming to the forefront again, State Attorney General Crawford Martin said in impromptu remarks during a speech in Eastland Monday.

Scheduled to argue before the Supreme Court next week, Gen. Martin said the case is one in which the federal government is suing the State of Texas for some \$200 million involving some 46,000 acres of Texas shore-line.

When the tideland bill was passed in the late 1950s, it provided that all other states bordering open water would relinquish all off-shore holdings further than three miles out, and Texas, beyond 10.5 miles out.

Now the federal government in its suit, wants that arrangement set up, and based on the coast-line of 1845. This would involve choice Salt Domes oil areas, Martin said.

Gov. Martin will argue before a seven-man court, he said, with Chief Justice Earl Warren and Thurgood Marshall sitting the hearing out. Warren was attorney general

of California at the time of the earlier decision and he has disqualified himself on that ground, and Marshall was U. S. Solicitor General at the time the suit against Texas was filed, so he's not going to sit. (It would have been his first case as a member of the Supreme Court.)

"About half my time is spent with the federal government," Martin said, "half the time they're suing us and the other half, we're suing them."

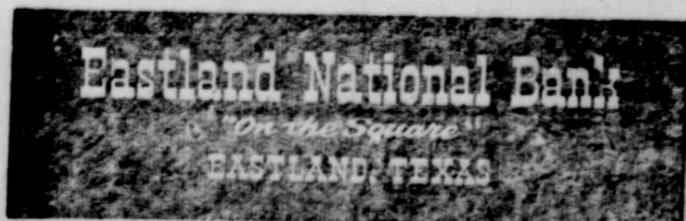

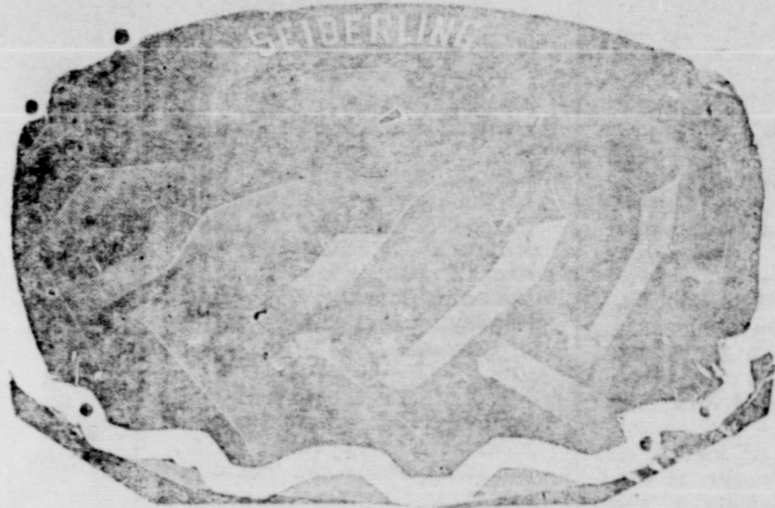

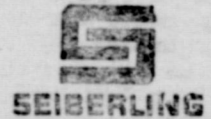

## Landowners Awarded By Condemnations

Three highway condemnation hearings caused particular interest in Court in Eastland last Friday as landowners, their attorneys and Highway Department and state attorneys argued the values of land, and amount of damages.

A special commission made up of Mrs. Ann Justice of Eastland, Lloyd Bruce of Ranger and Johnny Collins of Eastland heard and decided the cases.

Mrs. Matt (Docia) Robinson was awarded a settlement of \$45,000 by the commission for reported damages to some 97 acres out of a 720-acre ranch south of Ranger and east of the Ranger airport. (Mrs. Robinson reportedly had been offered \$20,000 in settlement.)

Her son, R. V. Robinson, also of Ranger, was awarded \$8,000 for damages, and Mrs. David David Pickrell was awarded \$15,000 for damages from the David Pickrell Estate.

The condemnations are the result of highway right-of-way negotiations for the project Interstate 20 highway through Eastland County.

Another hearing was tentatively set for Wednesday, Oct. 4, in the case of V. P. Moser, who owns land east of Eastland.

It is further ordered that various Election Precincts of Eastland County be renumbered as follows:

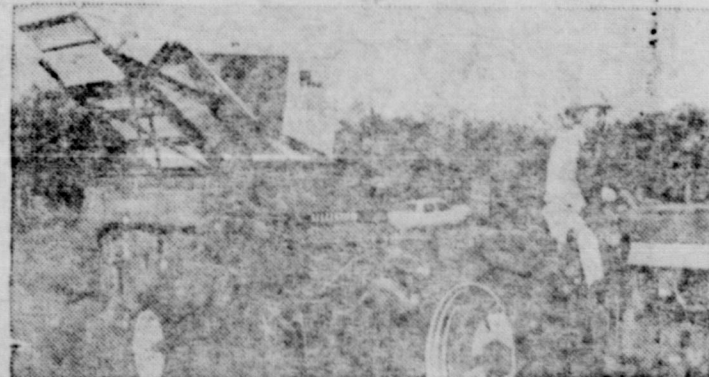

office he's held since 1952. Directors include Herman Schaefer and Cozart, both of Cisco; Norris of Eastland; Luke Palmer and Glenn Jordan, both of Gorman; Cowan Huiton of Rising Star; K. F. Kirk, of Ranger; R. L. Ricks and Mrs. Henry Fry, both of Cisco; and B. M. Campbell of Carbon.

Delegates include Mr. and Mrs. Campbell, Mr. and Mrs. Kimmell, Graham, Bill Claborn of Eastland, Cozart and Pete Hathcock of Ranger. Alternates are John Love, R. L. Richey and Henry Fry.
