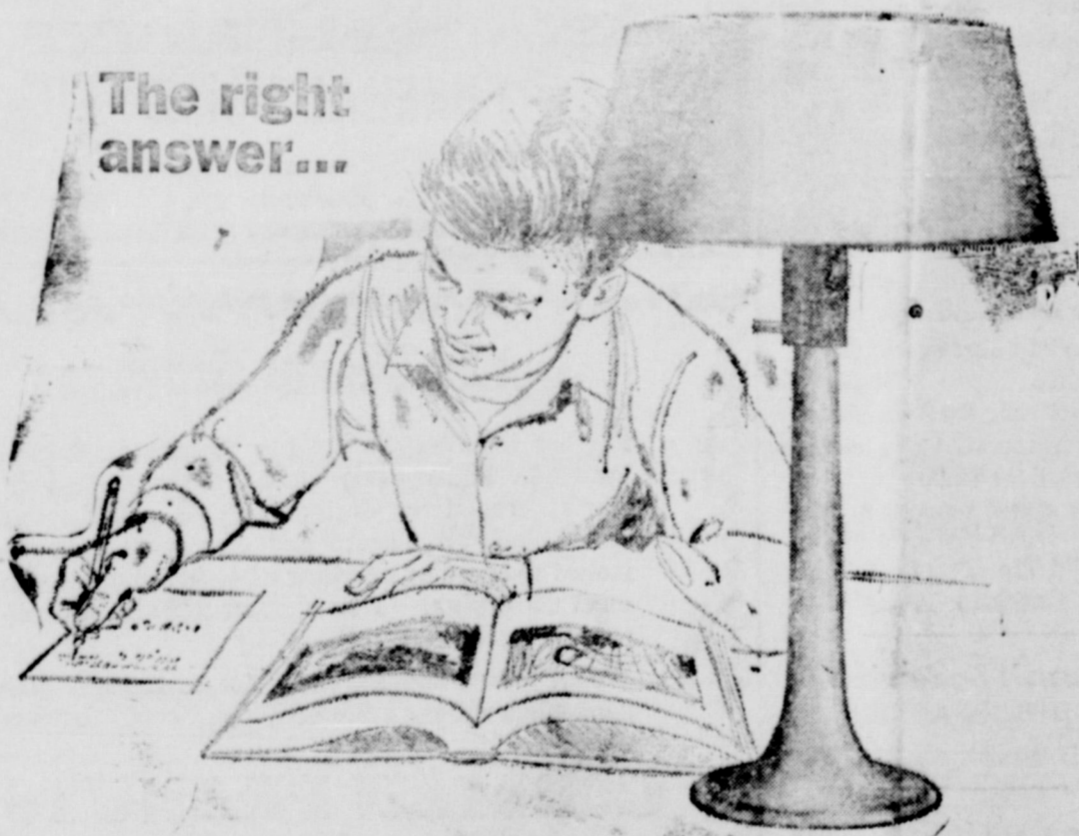

The Railroad Commission Tuesday ordered all oil and gas operators in Eastland County to quit using unlined salt water disposal pits by Jan. 1.

The action followed a show cause hearing Aug. 7. The commission said oil operators will be cut off Jan. 1 on any lease still using unlined disposal pits.

The commission found that pits are contributing to fresh water pollution in the area, and that a no-pit order was needed to prevent pollution.
