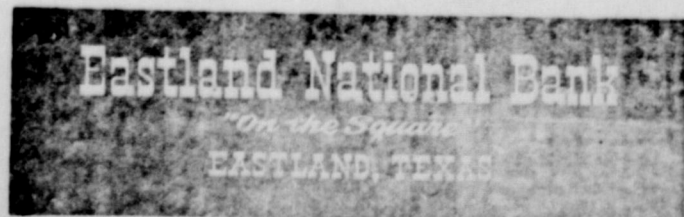

CJC VOCATIONAL NURSES SCORE HIGH IN STATE EXAMINATIONS

Mrs. Lavelle Hallmark, a graduate of the Cisco program of Cisco Junior College School of Vocational Nursing, scored 95.6, the highest score made by 602 candidates from 107 schools in Texas who passed the July examinations for vocational nursing license. Mrs. Hallmark is from Gorman, and received her clinical experience in Blackwell Hospital there with classes conducted at CJC.

Mrs. Veneta Mitchell, instructor for the Cisco program, stated that all of the graduates from her program who took the exam, 12 in all, received passing scores. The class average score was very good with three of the group scoring above 90.

Mrs. Mitchell said the ten Graham program graduates taking the July exam, also of CJC, receiving passing scores with a good class average.

Golden Eagle Passport Sales Show Increase

AUSTIN—The vacation season and the increasing numbers of outdoor vacationers have caused a flurry of activity in the Parks and Wildlife Department's sales of Golden Eagle Passports, according to C. L. Friou, assistant director of administrative services.

The acceleration began around the first of June, with the vacation season, and has increased ever since. Friou said the increased sales indicate vacationers are spending more of their vacation time in the outdoors.

A Golden Eagle Passport, costing seven dollars, will admit the purchaser, regardless of his mode of transportation and without further payment, any number of times to all designated Federal areas collecting entrance fees.

There are more than 2,000 of these areas in the United States, with some 68 in Texas alone.

Monies collected from the sale of Golden Eagle Passports are earmarked by Federal law for outdoor recreation. So far, some 60 per cent has been apportioned back to the states or through the states to local communities on a matching basis to provide near-to-home outdoor recreation areas.

Persons wishing to participate in Operation Golden Eagle may obtain their passport by mailing their seven-dollar check, made payable to "U. S. Bureau of Outdoor Recreation," to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, John H. Reagan Building, Austin, Texas, 78701.

Social Security Aids In Injuries Lasting 12 Months

Thousands of working Americans suffer serious illness or injury each year. Many of these workers recover within a short time and return to their jobs. Others cannot return to work for as long as a year and some are never able to work again. What happens to the families of workers whose earnings The amount of your monthly benefit depends on your average yearly earnings. For example, if your average earnings under social security are \$4,200 a year, your disability benefit will amount to \$124.20 each month. Monthly benefits also go to depend-

ents. A wage earner, his wife and two children, with the above average earnings would be entitled to a total of \$280.80 each month. It is important to remember that social security benefits are not paid automatically. Application should be made as soon as it seems likely the disability will prevent work for a year or longer. A representative of the Abilene social security office will be at Ranger on July 26 at 10 a. m. at the City Hall to help you in any way possible on any social security matter. stop? Fay Grant, Social Security Field Representative for Eastland County has these answers:

Social security disability insurance is the answer for employees and self-employed people who have paid security for at least 5 years out of the 10 years before their disability began. Individuals who became blind before age 31 may be insured with less than five years of work.

In addition, benefits are payable only if a worker has a disability that prevents him from doing any substantial gainful work. This disability must have lasted or is expected to last for at least 12 months.
