With a large percentage of weaving and spining mills shut down or operating on part time on acount of heavy cancellation of orders by buyers and large quantities of finished cloth which have been held by speculators coming into the market at less than cost prices, the market is in a state of stapnation, and heavy losses have been sustained. Price reductions which are being made by manufacturers range from 5 cents to 50 cents a yard on cloth, depending upon its quality and will reach the consumer this fall.

0 SOIL BLOWING SUGGESTION

While the winter wheat crop and much land of some of his neighbors was blown over into western Kansas during the recent "big blow," Paul Mead, one of the Farm Bureau members of west of Bertroud, saved his wheat and soil too, by plowing furrows across his wheat fields, throwing the soil away from the direction of the prevailing winds. Mr. Mead is very enthusiastic over this method of handling light soils, and the results he has attained should be noticed by the farmers of this country. He has an excellent stand of wheat which has apparently been damaged very little by severe winds, while in adjoining fields the wheat is a total loss. Mr. Mead plowed the furrows about every 75 to 100 feet. In case the furrows fill up as they sometimes do, he simply plows them out again.-Larimer County Farm Bureau News.

REASONS FOR FAILURES IN RETAIL BUSINESS

Appealing to the open-mindedness of the business men and their employees who attended his lecture last night, W. F. Brennan, lecturer, newspaper man, and business expert of the National Cash Register Co., Dayton, Ohio, presented in a forceful and graphic manner the reasons for failures in retail business.

Not only were his remarks of interest and value to the retailors, however, for the fundimental of business, the broad principles of commerce were brought out in such a manner that they could be adopted by men of any line of business or pro-

During the talk Mr. Brennan laid emphasis on the value of newspaper advertising to the retail merchants. He said in part: "I believe I am safe in saying that ten merchants fail today because they advertise too little, to everyone who fails because he advertises too much. Hundreds of stores have remained small because of this neglect.

"Make your ads different. Don't copy what other people say. Put your personality into them. Tell the story about your goods just as you would tell it in the store. If your ad is just like everybody else's it will not be

"Cuts are good if they really illustrate, but a bad rut is worse than none. Don't use a cut that isn't just what you want, simply because you can get it from a syndicate cheap. If you get a syndicate to plan your advertising, be sure to get individual attention. Ready made ads don't always apply to your particular business, and will not get results for your store. To make a favorable impression, an ad must have an attractive appearance, by having a symmetrical form, attractive lettering, and appealing illustrations.

'.In pre paring your ads write them out as best you can and then say the same thing in half as many words.

"Your advertising is your store news. If you haven't any make some. A new line of goods; cut prices on goods you want to turn over. It is easy enough to get news.

"Don't spend a few dollars in advertising and then say, 'advertising dosen't pay,' Advertising does pay as attested by thousands of merchants over the country who have become sucessful through its judicious use. It may take a little time to secure Joe Andrews, of Stamford, spent maximum returns, but if you make your store, you will not be disappointed with the results.




