## Disability Pay Is Not Limited To 'Permanent'

Disabled persons should take note that social security disability benefits are no longer limited to those with a "permanent" disability. R. R. Tuley, Jr., social security district manager in Abilene, said today. A worker may now be eligible for benefits if he has a disability which has lasted or is expected to last at least 12 months, and prevents him from working.

Although the disability provisions of the social security law were changed in July 1965, Tuley said, his office has seen evidence that some disabled workers have been passing up benefits because they had not heard of the 1965 changes. One important change, he said, removed the requirement that a disability be long continued or permanent without expectation of recovery. Another eases the work requirements for persons whose disability is blindness.

Under present law, a person who becomes blind before age 24 may be eligible for benefits with only 1 1/2 years of work in the 3 years before becoming blind. Blindness occurring before age 31, with social security credits for half of the time between age 21 and before becoming blind, may qualify the person for disability benefits.

Workers who become blind at age 31 or later, or who have disabilities other than blindness, need to have social security credit for at least 5 years out of the 10 years before their disabilities began.

Social Security payments for a disabled worker range from \$44.00 to \$139.90 a month, depending on the worker's average earnings under social security. Benefits may also be paid to certain of his dependents, Tuley said.

He urged disabled workers to inquire about their eligibility for these benefits at the Abilene social security office located at room 2321 Federal Building or meet a representative of that office when he is in your community. A schedule of visits is posted in all post offices.

## County Bonds Total \$14,116 In February

Guy Parker, Chairman of the Eastland County Savings Bonds Committee announced today that February sales of United States Savings Bonds in Eastland County totaled \$14,116. During the first two months of 1967 sales in Eastland County totaled \$31,383 which is eight per cent of the 1967 goal of \$370,000.

During the first two months of 1967 Savings Bond sales in Texas totaled \$29,451,247.00 which is 16 per cent of the states goal of \$181.3 million and a 15.2 per cent increase over sales during the same period of 1966.

Nationally, the sale of Savings Bonds during February totaled \$426 million and were 23 per cent higher than a year ago, and the highest for any February in seven years. The January-February total was \$917 million, 12 per cent over sales for the first two months of 1966 and the highest January-February sales since 1963.

## Jefferson To Conduct Historical Pilgrimage

The East Texas town of Jefferson is one progressive community that can point with more than a touch of pride to its rich historical background.

Located at the intersection of Highways 49 and 59, the town boasts 46 buildings that have the official historic Texas Medallion. Once the largest inland shipping point in the entire state, the impressive Big Cypress River still flows gently past the business section.

In order that posterity might fully appreciate its heritage, in 1948 the Jefferson Historical Society and Museum was organized. The museum is housed in a building constructed in 1888 and for many years used by the Federal Government for a Post Office and Federal Court. The Historical Society purchased this building in 1965.

The basement, three floors and garrett provides the proper setting and adequate space for the Society's large and interesting collections.

The Museum is one of some 15 points of interest to be included in tours when the Jesse Allen Wise Garden Club sponsors the towns 20th Annual Historical Pilgrimage April 28-29-30.

Other attractions include four performances of the "Diamond Bessie Murder Trial" staged in the Jefferson Playhouse, a colorful downtown parade and two, three and one-half hour tours daily.

Dwaine Dennis, editor of Jefferson's newspaper, The Jimplecote and former Times editor, is in charge of publicity and assures prospective visitors that it will be an occasion to remember, time and money well spent.
