




BUSINESS GROWING STEADILY BETTER SURVEY INDICATES

WASHINGTON, Dec., 7 .- Continued improvement in business conditions in October reflected notably in increased output of iron and steel and textile products and also a widespread stimulation in building and its related in dustries, was reported by the depadtment of commerce today in its "survey of current business." While prices continued to decline slightly during Octobe,r the survey showed, the relative stability of prices as compared with proceeding months and the improved banking situation as evidenced by smaller loans and lower interest rates were cited as conditions favor able to conditions favorable to continued business improvement. With the exception of metals, the quantitiveproduction in the important inlustries was shown by the survey to be equal or greater than before the war average of 1913, many lines, including pig iron and cotton and tobacco manufactures, showing an increse of about one-third over the minimum product. ion for the current year. An increase of 70 per cent over minimum was repored in the production of bituminous coal, while the output of wheat flonr cement and wool products was shown to have been approximatly double the minimum figures.—Star-Telegram -Trade in Spur-






