grow cotton and buy feeds cheaper than they could produce them. There may have been a time though I doubt it, when Texas farmers or farmers in some sections of Texas could have grown cotton to purchase feeds and other supplies, cheaper than they could produce them on their farms. But if such a time ever existed, it has passed, perhaps never to return. "Texas may be temporarily prosper ous as soon as the farmers grow a good crop for which they receive reasonable prices, permanent pros perity is dependent on a permanent ly prosperous agriculture and a per manent agriculture is depend ent upon a readjustment of our crop ning system. There is danger just now that in our distress the farmers of Texas for get the lesson of the past and that they will substantially increase the cotton acreage in 1922. All of us are quick to forget many lessons dear ly learned. Cotton is the most de lusive plant of all plants. It has kept the farmers who have grown it in largest quantities in economic slavery for a century. "If the teachings of the past are not heeded our situation will surely grow worse instead of better. Under our wasteful system of agricultural practice our soils have robbed of much of their virgin fertility. In the five year period from 1864 to 1869 the average acre production of lint cotton in Texas was 267 pounds. For the same period the average acre production of lint cotton in North Carolina was 165 pounds. In the five year period from 1914 to 1919 the average production per acre in North Carolina was 265 pounds. "In a little more than half a cen production had declin r cent while the acre
