Deadline Near To Have Motor Vehicle Check

AUSTIN-The director of the Texas Department of Public Safety reminded motorists today that only six weeks remain before enforce-ment begins on the 1967 vehi-

cle inspection stickers.
Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., DPS Director, said that the law allows for no extension of the April 15 deadline and urged drivers to have their vehicles inspected before the

the last minute lines begin Garrison pointed out that some two and one-quarter million vehicles in Texas remain to be inspected in order to comply with state law. This amounts to approximately 14 vehicles per working day for each of the 5,500 of-

ficial inspection stations. "Undoubtedly," Garris on stated, "many motorists will wait until the last day, and it may be very difficult to find an inspection station that is not swamped with late comers.

"In order to secure an orderly flow of the remaining uninspected vehicles through the inspection stations we would urge each motorist to have the inspection attended to as soon as possible. This during a routine visit to an authorized neighbored inspection station."

The high rate of home accidents makes it important that houses be designed and built to eliminate as many hazards as possible. Building safety precautions into new construction is less expensive than adding them later.

Some of the design features will help to assure an efficient plan include: The placement of related activity areas on the same level and close together. For example: a play area for preschool children should be located near the mother's work area. Also short, direct traffic routes which are adequately wide for their purpose should be planned for. Check your house plans for adequate storage space in every room where it will be needed. Too, incorpor at e adequate non-glare light, both natural and artificial in your home. It's also important that no floor level, and no sharp corners or projections be includ-

To remove black heel marks from floors, rub lightly with fine steel wool dipped in the wax you are using on the floor.

Area Legislator On Committee To Study Race Bill

AUSTIN—State Representative Burke Musgrove, a new member of the House from Breckenridge, will be one of the select committee members to decide the success or failure of pari-mutuel betting in the House of Representatives — and possibly in the State.

The controversial measure has been referred to the 21 members of the House Counties Committee, which could conceivably keep the measure from coming up for a vote on the House floor, thereby killing the bill for at least this session.

With over a hundred other bills pending committee action by this group, the CounInduction quotas for the Arties Committee has been one of the busiest of the 45 committees in the House of Representatives.
