## The Santa Anna City Council voted in its last session to raise voted in its last session to raise the basic water rate to Santa

 Anna users by 50 cents.Purpose of Purpose of the increase in
water rates is to raise funds for water rates is to raise funds for
the cleaning of the water mains in the City, now in progress. The cleaning operation will
cost the city $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 12,500$ cost the city $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 12,500$
when completed. This is the first complete cleaning of the
entire local water distribution system since its instrallation.
Without the water rate increase, Without the water rate increase
the City would have to issue bonds to pay for the cleaning operations, which would be
much more costly to the City C nd individual taxpayers. Cost of the cleaning operation
is based on a rate of $221 / 2$ cent per foot of pipe cleaned. The
City has 40,000 to 50,000 linear leet of water mains.
Even with the increase, th ecal water rate will be considrounding communities. The cleaning was necessitated
by a condition that develops in pipes of the type used in the
City system. Known as a tuberculous condition, it as a causes the
cradual closing of the pipe culous condition, it causes phe
gradual closing of the pipe
through the growth of deposits through the growth of deposits
of rust and minerals from the of rust and minerals from the
water. Some of the six inch diameter pipe in the local system has been reduced to less than
three inches by these deposits, three inches by these deposits,
and four inch pipe has an inand four inch pipe has an in-
side diameter of less than two
inches inches.
To clean these pipes, a trench
is dug over the main, is dug over the main, and a sec-
tion of the pipe is removed tion of the pipe is removed. A
small tractorlike vehicle is
placed near the trench, and a long, flexible rod is inserted in in
the pipe, connected to a rotary the pipe, connected to a rotary power takeof on the tractor. The
rod rotates at high speed, caus-
ing the cutting head ing the cutting head on the rod
to remove the deposits in the pipe. Additional sections are
added, lengthening the rod as the pipe is cleaned out, until the length limit of the rod is reach-
ed. Then the pipe is closed, the trench refilled, and the crew location.
