Carbon Will Play Sidney Friday In Comanche for Bi-District Title

The Carbon Wolverines will meet Sidney in a Bi-District play off game in Comanche Friday evening, Nov. 25, at Indian Stadium.

Representatives of the two schools met in Rising Star Saturday morning and flipped for the site — Carbon having selected Eastland as location, but Sidney won the toss and choose Comanche for the tilt.

Tickets at \$1.25 for adults and 50 cents for students and children will be available at several places in Eastland this week, including the Eastland Telegram office.

The Carbon Wolverines will meet Sidney for the bi-district championship, with the winner to face Novice for the regional Six-Man title.

Both Carbon and Sidney have had but one defeat each during the season — Carbon was defeated by Tolar, 44-14, and Carbon downed Sidney, 24-16, early in the season.

The Wolverines, under the direction of Coach Larry Allen, put down Putnam, 60-24, Thursday night to round out the regular season of play and earn the District 9-A Six-man title.

Starting lineup for Carbon includes: Left end, Herbert Casey, 160; center, Jimmy Nelson, 160; right end, Larry Bryant,

165; quarterback, Alvie Allison, 185; half back, Pay Kanady, 160; and fullback, Ronnie Hughes, 185.

Against Putnam, Casey and Kanady both scored touchdowns in the first quarter; Hughes got two TDs in the second and Kanady repeated with another in the second; Hughes got two in the third; and Bryant got a touchdown in the fourth. Allison kicked six extra tries for 12 more points.

Supt. Jimmy Hughes and Coach Allen report that the Carbon team is in fine shape for the upcoming game. "Our boys have a lot of bruises from the Putnam game, but nothing serious," Hughes said.

Apparently the Wolverines and the Sidney team are the most nearly equal teams in the area, and the bi-district game should be one of spectacular matching, they report.

"Sidney has improved since we played them," Hughes said. "And even then we had a close 24-16 ball game, so this one should really be a good one."

Carbon managers are James Carter and Lester Swan. Six-man playoffs go but to the regional level.

Fans from Eastland County and throughout the area are expected to be on hand for the big bi-district playoff.

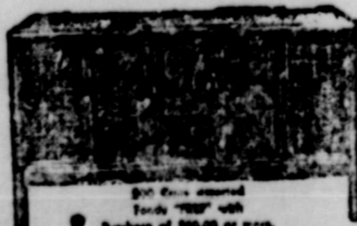

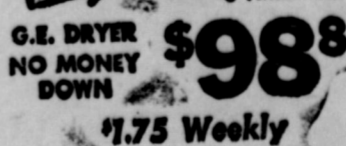
