Nov. 8 Election Ballot Is King-Sized Whopper

"Horse-blanket size" is the ballot for the Tuesday, Nov. 8 general election.

The official ballot measures 15 inches by 20 inches. The left side pertains to state, district, county, and in some instances, precinct races. The right side is devoted to the 16 proposed constitutional amendments.

Only contested race expected to cause much observation is that of United States Senator, which pits Democrat, former Attorney General Waggoner Carr and Republican Incumbent Sen. John Tower.

There are Democratic no-

There are Democratic nominees from governor through county school superintendent, and in some precincts in Eastland County, county commissioners and justices of the peace.

Republican nominees are from governor down through state treasurer; and the Constitution Party lists nominees down through railroad commissioner. The Conservative party has only one candidate — for governor. (The Constitution Party is running one "Jesse Lee James" against Democratic Incumbent Jesse James for state treasurer.)

Wells Dalton's name will appear, unopposed, on the Eastland and Olden ballot for Justice of the Feace, as will M. D. Underwood's on the Ranger ballot.

Gorman, Carbon, Kokomo and Desdemona ballots will list Dick Foster as a candidate for County Commissioner from that precinct; and the Cisco - Scranton ballots will carry C. B. Dill's name as from that precinct. Mr. W. L. Lewis' name will also be on the Cisco - Scranton ballots, for JP.

Unopposed Democratic nominees on the district and county level are: Omar Burleson, congressman 17th district; Cecil C. Collings, associate justice. court of civil appeals; Frank Sparks, district judge, 91st district court; Tom Creighton, state senator, 22nd district; Burke Musgrove state representative 63rd district; Scott Bailey, county judge; John son Smith, county clerk; Ellen Justice, county treasurer; Roy L. Lane, district clerk; and O. L. Stamey, county school superintendent.

Doe Permit Distribution Set Oct 31

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department announced that anterless deer permits will be issued for Eastland County on October 31, from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. in Eastlan i at the county courthouse.

Land owners or their agents are urged to be present to obtain their permits during the period scheduled for per-

mit issuance. A map of the county showing compartments and rate of issuance will be posted in the courthouse.

Permits are to be issued only for two sections in the extreme eastern part of the county. In the area north of Interstate Hwy. 20 (U. S. 80), and east of the Caddo road, one permit will be issued for each 150 acres. One permit per 50 acres will be issued in the area south of Interstate 20, and generally east of FM Road 571.

"On this the 10th day of October, 1966, the Commissioners' Court of Eastland County, Texas, convened in regular session with all members present. Among other proceedings, the following

order was passed: "Whereas ,there has been submitted for approval Articles of Agreement and By-laws

Commission called the West Central Texas Council of Governments; and

"Whereas, it is the opinion of the Coummissioners' Court of Eastland County, Texas, that it is in the best interests of the County of Eastland to join such Regional Planning Commission in order to share in the benefits to be afforded thereby and to support the functions of such Planning Commission; it is therefore,

"Ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners' Court of Eastland County,

"Section 1: That the Coun-

ty of Eastland does hereby join and become a part of the West Central Texas Council of Governments.

"Section 2: That the Articles of Agreement and Bylaws of the West Central Texas Council of Governments be and are hereby in all things approved and adopted.

Section 3.: That pursuant to Article VIII (A) of the Bylaws of the West Central Texas Council of Governments there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$587.61 to pay the first annual dues for the membership of the County of Eastland in such Regional Planning Commission.

Section 4: That Scott Bailey, county judge, be and is hereby authorized to sign the Articles of Agreement of the West Central Texas Council of Governments for and on behalf of the County of East-
