Assistant County Agent Cohen Well Qualified For 4-H Work

"I like Eastland County and its people more each day," he says.

Cohen is a native of Llano County, where his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Q. Cohen, ranch cattle, hogs and goats. He has a sister presently attending Texas Tech and a brother who has just started to school.

A 1965 graduate of Texas A&M, Cohen has a major in animal science. He trained to be a refueling specialist in the Air Force, while in technical school at Amarillo Air Force Base, where he also completed basic training. He is a member of the Air Force reserve assigned to Kelly Air Force Base in San Antonio.

Cohen took his extension service training in Williamson County.

He was an outstanding 4-H member in Llano Co., winning a trip to the National 4-H Congress in Chicago under the Santa Fe Awards Program. He received a scholarship under the same program, by entering his 4-H record books.

He was a member of FA for four years in high school, played football three years, and was on the track team four years. He ran the mile in track.

His major responsibility in Eastland County is working with the 4-H Clubs. Mrs. Wanda Chilton, assistant home demonstration agent, will also be working with these clubs.

DeMarquis Gordon, county agent, says, "Mr. Cohen is well qualified for his job, and we are looking forward to working with him."

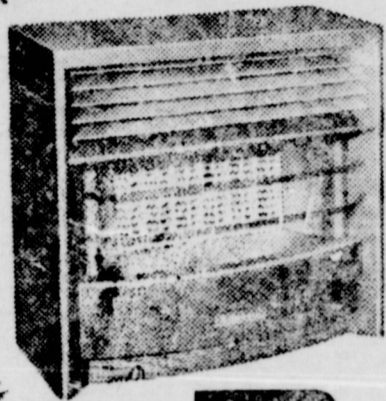

200 COUNTY YOUNGSTERS CELEBRATE 4-H CLUB WEEK

National 4-H Club Week is the week of September 24 - October 1, 1966. During this week it is the aim of 4-H Clubs in America to interest other young people in the 4-H Club Program.

The 4-H program has been marked by change since its inception more than 60 years ago. Greater variety of educational projects, more emphasis on the improvement of the boy and girl and a program with appeal for the young people everywhere are some of the changes.

A more recent but no less important change is the demand for 4-H in towns and cities across the country. Still an important educational force in rural America, more than 77 per cent of its members reside in rural areas, nearly half a million members now live in towns and cities of 2,500 or more. A decade ago, 86.5 per cent lived on farms and in rural areas and 13.5 per cent in urban areas. 4-H has truly become an organization for all youth of America.

Many of the older youth have developed the idea that 4-H is "kid-stuff." If this

is so then explain why more than half the 2,221,119 members are age 13 and above. 4-H is an organization oriented toward informal education in many subject matter fields and in character development, leadership, and citizenship. This program is designed to involve young people 9-19 years of age.

Eastland County has 200 4-H Club members enrolled in nine clubs. These young people are not roaming around trying to find something to occupy themselves. They are working collectively through their respective 4-H Clubs for the good of the United States of America. These 200 young people and the 44 adult leaders helping them are not complaining about the young people of America; they are doing something about it. Join a 4-H Club in your area.
