## COWAN HUTTON NAMED TO COUNTY FHA COMMITTEE

Appointment of Cowan Hutton, Route 4, Cisco, as a member of the Eastland County Farmers Home Administration Committee was announced this week by Darrell Cooper, FHA county supervisor.

Hutton succeeds Oscar L.

Schaefer whose term expired on July 1.

The new county committeeman resides near the Sabanno community, where his farm holdings are located. He is farming approximately 230 acres of peanuts this year.

Hutton is one of the first persons to irrigate peanuts in Eastland County, and he has had success in this venture. He has a herd of commercial cattle in addition to his crop.

Mr. Hutton joins Coda A. McDaniel and Tuit Norris on the committee. The purpose of the county committee is to act on the eligibility of individual applications for all types of FHA loans in Eastland County. They also review borrower's progress, aid the county supervisor in adapting the agency's loan policies to local conditions, and offer technical agriculture advice.

The Eastland County FHA office is now processing three Community Facility loan applications. They are for a rural water system at Morton Valley, a recreation area at Cisco, and a peanut drying plant and storage facilities at Pioneer.

Two Community Facility loans have already been closed. One for a water system at Olden, and one for a recreation area near Pioneer. The five projects involve loans amounting to approximately \$747,000.

### Plentiful Foods Are Listed For Picnic Month

COLLEGE STATION — July is Picnic Month. And with July comes a variety of picnic foods in abundant supply, reports the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Such fruits as fresh plums, peaches and watermelons make the perfect climax to the best picnics. Young chickens — fried and ready for the family outing — will provide the perfect main course. And

there are lots of fresh vegetables, such as tomatoes, onions and fresh corn, that will make tasty additions to your picnic meals.

This year's California plum production is estimated at 115,000 tons —

Peach production is also estimated slightly below that of last year but well above average.

Barring adverse weather, July should be a prime month for watermelons. Watermelon acreage is almost up to last year, when large harvests went to market. Fresh vegetables will be present in abundance during this big summer vegetable month.

A wildcat oil test that will go to the Ellenburger lime at about 4,000 feet has been announced for the Eastland County area six miles southwest of Cisco. The project is the O. Seldon Baker No. 1 Brown.

The Graham operator has a 320 acre lease and the location was given as 2,310 feet from the south and 330 feet from the east lines of Section 110, Block 3, H&TC Survey. Two re-entry projects have been announced for the county.

Dalton Moore Engineering Co. of Abilene has announced plans to deepen the well drilled 1963 by Tex - Star Oil Company and Low Drilling Company as their No. 1 R. E. Baggett, located near the Eastland - Stephens County line some eight miles northeast of Cisco.

The venture went to about 3,500 feet and plans call for the hole to be deepened to the Duffer lime at about 3,760 feet. Location is on a 160 acre lease 100 feet from the south and 2,964 feet from the east lines of Section 457, SP Survey.

Elsewhere, Piedmont Oil Company of Denton has announced plans to re-enter the W. B. Hamilton et al No. 1 Mrs. J. F. Penn, drilled in 1952, and deepen it to 4,300 feet for a test of the Ellenburger. Location is two and a half miles west of Cisco. It was understood that a gas show was logged in the test that was abandoned. Location was given as 330 feet from the south and east lines of Section 11, Block E, BBB&C Survey.

O-K Exploration Co. of Abilene has announced a shallow test as their No. 1 Jeff Pippen, six and a half miles west of Cisco near Dothan. The hole will go to 600 feet to the Dothan Sand. Location is 1,290 feet from the south and 783 feet from the east lines of Section 3163, TE&L Survey.
