

The city of Paris was practically solid for the issue and the rural sections of the county practically solid against it. The Commercial Culb of Paris has for several years been trying to bond the county for one million dollars to improve its public highways but a quiet canvass proved that the plan would be defeated at the polls. The city of Paris was practically solid for the issue and the rural sections of the county practically solid against it. 




