## County's School Aid Program May Expand

Two additional counties are expected to be added for the 1966-67 school year, bringing to five the number of counties served by the Eastland County School Superintendent's office in the administration of the various federal aid to education programs now in progress.

This fact was reported by Coordinator Bruce Golemon of Cisco in a talk before the Eastland Lions Club Tuesday at noon.

The three counties presently served include Eastland, Palo Pinto and Shackelford. Through August of this year, Golemon said that federal education monies will amount to \$240,000 in Eastland county, exclusive of that being used in the two junior colleges.

The eight schools in the

county joined, he said, in a common unit and are participating in several programs, including the NCY (Neighborhood Youth Corps); Titles One and Two of Public Law 89.0; and Cisco will have a Head Start program.

Title One has amounted to some \$124,000 at \$194 per eligible student. (Eastland gained about \$20,000 extra for this program), and Title Two provides books, library materials, and audio visual materials.

The schools have averaged 155 students employed on the NYC program with each earning \$1.25 an hour for ten hours a week.

The county will probably go into Title Three of the law next year, he said.

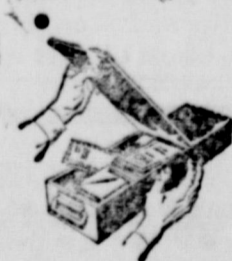

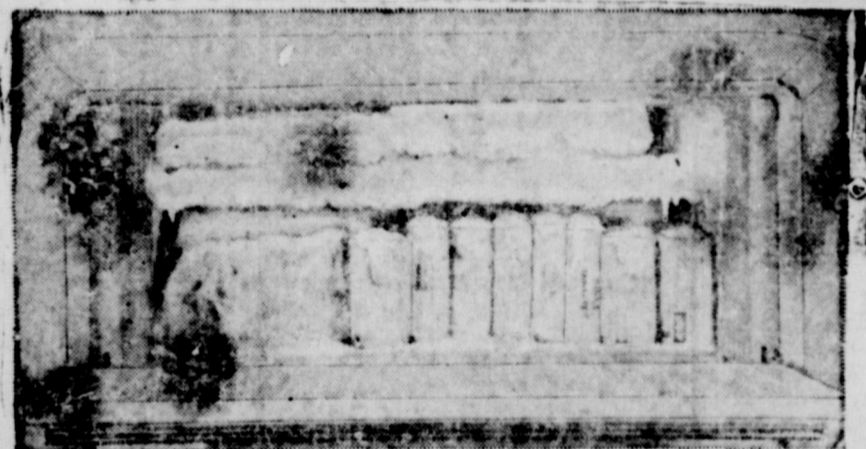

## Browsing with Bev

### Honey Tips

To measure honey — measure shortening first and then measure honey in the same measuring cup — slides out with ease.

To replace other sweetening with honey — In a cake or cookie recipe that calls for other sweetening, the general rule is to reduce the amount of liquid one-quarter cup for each cup of honey used.

To liquify honey that has granulated or solidified — Place the container in a bowl of warm water (not warmer than the hand can bear) until all crystals are melted and honey is liquid. Unless otherwise specified, honey in recipes should be in liquid form. Granulated honey may be used with equal success in baked goods.

To purchase honey — Select the flavor you desire. The flavor depends upon the kind of flowers from which bees gather the nectar. If you have storage space, it is more economical to buy honey in large containers. A cup of honey weighs approximately 12 ounces, one-fifth of which is moisture.

## Eminent Domain Steps Taken By County Court

County Commissioners met Monday morning, May 9, in the Commissioners Courtroom of the Court House and discussed with Buddy Haun and Jack Kirby, both with the State Highway Department, a

matter concerning the needed right of way for widening Highway 183. The Court passed a resolution to authorize eminent domain proceedings on all parcels of land which are not signed before Sunday, May 15, according to County Judge Scott Bailey.

Commissioners discussed the establishment of a neighborhood road in the Cisco area and the Court passed an order declaring a road across the property of Willis Parker, southeast of Cisco, connecting the property of Dan Wendt with the County Road System.

Also discussed was the proposal of a neighborhood road across the property near Carbon of Dick Pruett, connecting J. E. McDaniels farm with the County Road System.

Sheriff Lefty Sublett appeared before the court, requesting that commissioners inspect the county jail, where repairs are badly needed after damaged when some prisoners made an attempted jail break.

The sheriff also stated that the sheriff's department is being over-worked and needs more men, Judge Bailey said.

Co-chairman of the celebration is LeRoy Witzsche. Other chairmen are David Cunningham, beauty pageant; Allen Evans, tickets; Mike Sitten, seating; Jim Horn, publicity; Gayle Baucum, watermelon contest; Royce Taylor, fencing.

The Jaycees said that their annual July the Fourth celebration is made possible by the cooperation of the Lake Cisco businesses, the American Legion and the City Commission.

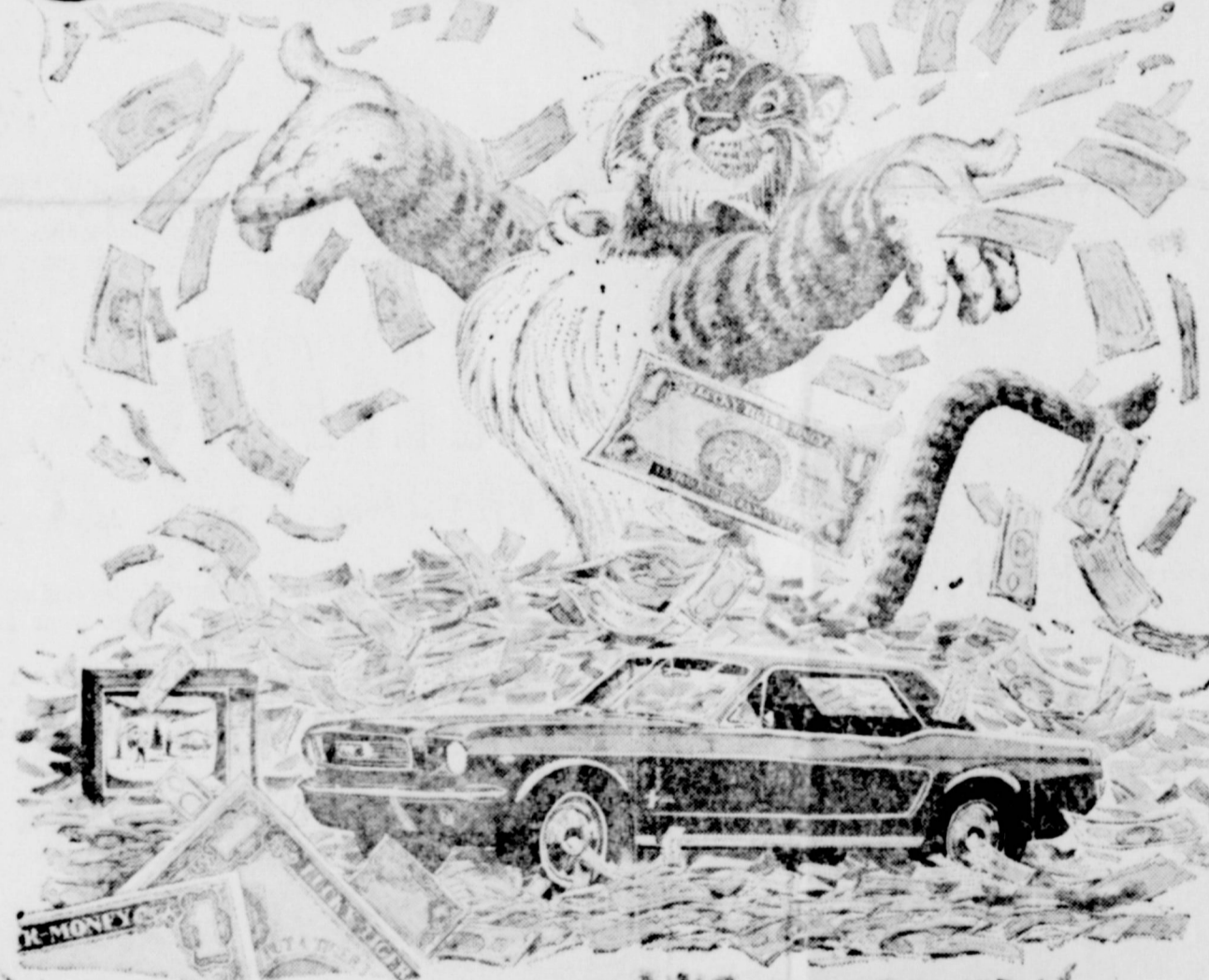
