The paper, entitled "1414 m-c-SEC Results of 1963 Jupiter Observations," was co-authored by A. C. Miller of the United States Naval Research Laboratory in Washington, D.C.

Griffen is presently employed by Air Force Western Test Range at Vandenberg Air Force Base, California.

Griffen attended Carbon schools and graduated from Carbon High School in 1951. He attended Arlington State College and Texas Christian University. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in physics and math from Texas Western University in El Paso in 1963 and was in the top 25 per cent of his graduating class Service Record Navy in 1952-55. Scott Bailey had an easy win for County Judge over John Hart in last Saturday's Democratic Primary by a vote of 2922 to 1597. This was the only contested county race.

In the Commissioner prec. 2 race, Glenn Justice was defeated by Dick Foster in a close race 487 to 432. The Carbon vote for Justice was 186 to Foster 44. Scott Bailey got 165 to Hart 37.

In the State Legislature McGroove led the ticket trailed by Musselman. Saul Pullman and Pat McGorgh. Pullman carried Eastland County by receiving 1974 votes.

In state races John Conally reelected Governor and Pres. Smith reelected Lt. Governor, won easily over their opponents. Tom Creighton had an easy win for reelection to the State Senate over his opponent, Vernon Smith.

Ancient Line Turned Up In City Street

History was once again made on the streets of Eastland Friday morning when a construction crew from R.M. Sneed Constructoin Co., working on a Texas Electric Service Co. project, stuck a wooden water line, which is believed to have been laid some 50 years ago.

One historian was quoted as having said that the present pavement was constructed in 1919 and the wooden pipe,

made of cypress, was already fixed in place at that time.

The hollow device was 10 inches in diameter and was the main water line for the city of Eastland, authorities say.

The workmen found it to be in a deteriorating condition, resembling a rotting tree trunk.

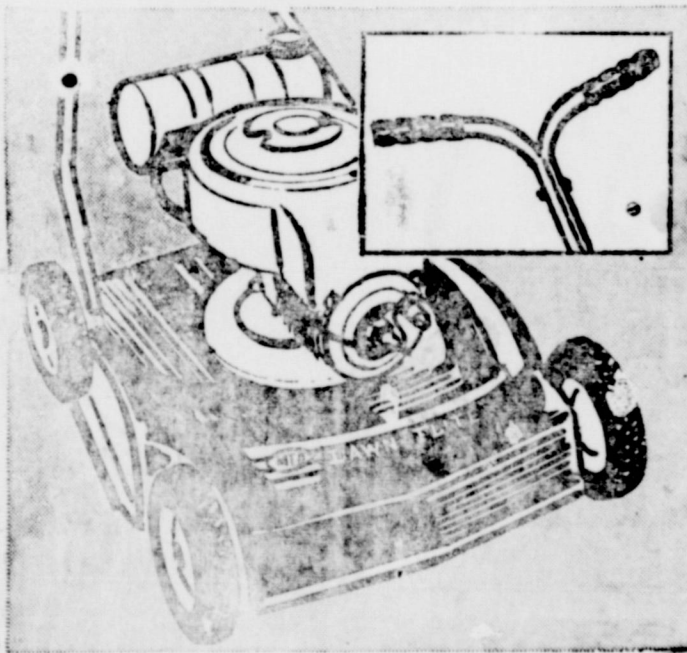
