Ancient Line Turned Up In City Street

History was once again made on the streets of Eastland Friday morning when a construction crew from R.M. Sneed Constructoin Co., working on a Texas Electric Service Co. project, stuck a wooden water line, which is believed to have been laid some 50 years ago.

One historian was quoted as having said that the present pavement was constructed in 1919 and the wooden pipe,

made of cypress, was already fixed in place at that time.

The hollow device was 10 inches in diameter and was the main water line for the city of Eastland, authorities say. The workmen found it to be in a deterioting condition, re-sembling a rotting tree trunk.




