Midnight, Saturday, April 23, is deadline for filing col-lege qualification tests for military deferments, East-land-Stephens County Selective Service Board Secretary Jewell Reaves has announced.

New directives are also being announced pertaining to school deferments as follows: At the close of the present school year (late May or early June), all fullterm college freshmen must be in the upper one-half of the male class or make 70 on the College Qualification Tests; sophomores must be in the upper


