





industries exist. Holland is a free trade country, and farmer and business man alike believe that it should be. They argue that free trade allows the business man a greater field for buying, that it affords the farmer cheap labor, cheap machinery and an open market in many lands and that it maintains a low cost of living for the laborer himself.

Cooperative credit is well organmed. Raiffeisen banks are numerous and are similar to those of other countries.

To find out the real conditions on the farm I went out into the country about seven miles from Leeuwarden to talk to an old farmer, who is typical of his province. The whole section is below the level of the sea, and the roads I traveled over were brick paved because of the heavy sands. J. A. Bergstra has been on the same land for 35 years. As is the custom, his house is built on piles driven far into the earth to secure a good foundation, and the living rooms and barn are in one building. The kitchen is detached. The tiled roof is very high, and slopes sharply. There is ample room for the 30 cattle, four horses and 14 sheep, with plenty of feed for the winter. In bad weather it is not necessary to go out of doors at all in order to feed and care for the stock.

When I produced my credentials as member of the American Commission I received a hearty welcome, and was shown into the kitchen-dining-Foom because, as Frau Bergstra exand even June afternoons are chilly.

The room was of ordinary size. In one end was a big, old fashioned fireplace, with a pot hanging in the middle. On the mantle were half-dozen old Dutch plates, and on the wall were scenes from farm life. The table was prettily but plainly covered, and there were several chairs. Here, as all through the house, the most scrupulous cleanliness prevailed. The one maid was treated almost as a member of the family.

Herr Bergstra was dressed very much like the American farmer dresses, but wore the usual black vest which comes up above the collar. Frau Bergstra had on the Freisian dress, including the Kaps, or gold head piece in which many of the peasants invest their savings. The lace cap over the gold was becoming and attractive.

Land in Friesland is worth about \$400 an acre, no unusual price in the Netherlands. Herr Bergstra rents 100 acres-the land is not for sale. The charge is \$16 an acre, or four per cent of the value of the farm, which is the normal return on an investment of

Thirty-seven and one-half acres is you wait. ootato land, the rest is in grass. Every third year beets and similar crops are grown on the potato land as a rotation. Hay is rarely sold; it is usually fed to tock. Though the winters are long and hard, the summer is almost endless. In season there is almost 18 hours of sunshine daily, so that two and often three cuttings of hay are

The yearly income from the land is about \$80 an acre. Of this one-fifth goes for rent, one-fifth is spent for fertilizer, one-fifth for labor, onefifth for capital depreciation, interest, and an automobile building, represent-

Employers must insure their laborers, but the rate is low and is based on wages paid and not on the number of individuals. Insurance for laborers getting 3,000 florins a year costs three or four florins.

Cooperation as I have said, has spread. When I asked Herr Bergstra what he thought of it he was surprised at the question. I explained that the movement is just gaining headway in America, "Tell the farmers it fine," he said, "wonderful."

"Why," I asked. "When we had no cooperative dairies,' he answered "we had to make our butter and cheese at home. It was a bother for the women and the product was of uncertain quality, so that we received poor prices. Now we can use every bit of milk we have, and get better prices, because the quality is always the same. And now we can send agents abroad to find markets for us."
