Duncan and Pack are assured a place on the school board, but the tie between Warren and Morgan will be decided later.

In Tuesday's City election, John Rice and Clint Britton were elected Aldermen and J. W. Guy was reelected Mayor.

London Is Named Board President

Elected to seats on the Cisco Junior College Board of Regents Saturday were incumbent Rudolph Schaefer and J. D. Yardley and John Huffmyer, incumbent and president of the board, Dr. H. C. Brown, lost his bid for reelection. He received 413 votes.

Voters numbered 990 at the polls. Incumbents Lloyd McGrew and J. V. Heyser Jr. were reelected to two posts on the Public Schools board.

In the CJC Board election, John Huffmyer, pharmacist, received 279 votes; Rudolph Schaefer, building contractor, 461; and J. D. Yardley, operator of the Spot Restaurant, 435.

In the Public Schools Board election, Lloyd McGrew received 703 votes and J. V. Heyser Jr., 617. The one other candidate, Ed Farley, received 556.

Other candidates for the CJC Board and number of votes received were James Cotton, 401; John Webb, 256; Gene Damron, 233; and A. R. Westfall Jr., 172. The third incumbent on the CJC Board, Joe Philpott, did not run for office.

Public Schools trustees serve for terms of three years. CJC regents serve for six-year terms.

The three new board members — Mr. Huffmyer, Mr. Yardley and Mr. Schaefer — were sworn in as the board held a re-organization meeting at a noon meeting Tuesday at the Victor Hotel.

Lloyd London, a hold-over member, was elected board president to succeed Dr. Brown. Mr. Yardley was named vice president, and Mr. Huffmyer was elected secretary. Retiring officers other than Dr. Brown were C. B. Rust, vice president, and Joe Philpott, secretary.

Mr. Brown offered congratulations to the new board.

Cross Country Horseman Rides Through Eastland County Towns

Tom Powell, Rhode Islander, must have said a lot of "Giddaps" and "Wnoas" since November. That's when he mounted Sioux in Saunderstown, R.I. and headed west for El Paso.

Last week the lone horseman, and his 12-year-old mare, Sioux, sauntered through Ranger, Eastland and Cisco. Sioux got a new pair of shoes in Ranger from Gary Smith. That was her third pair since leaving the smallest state in the Union.

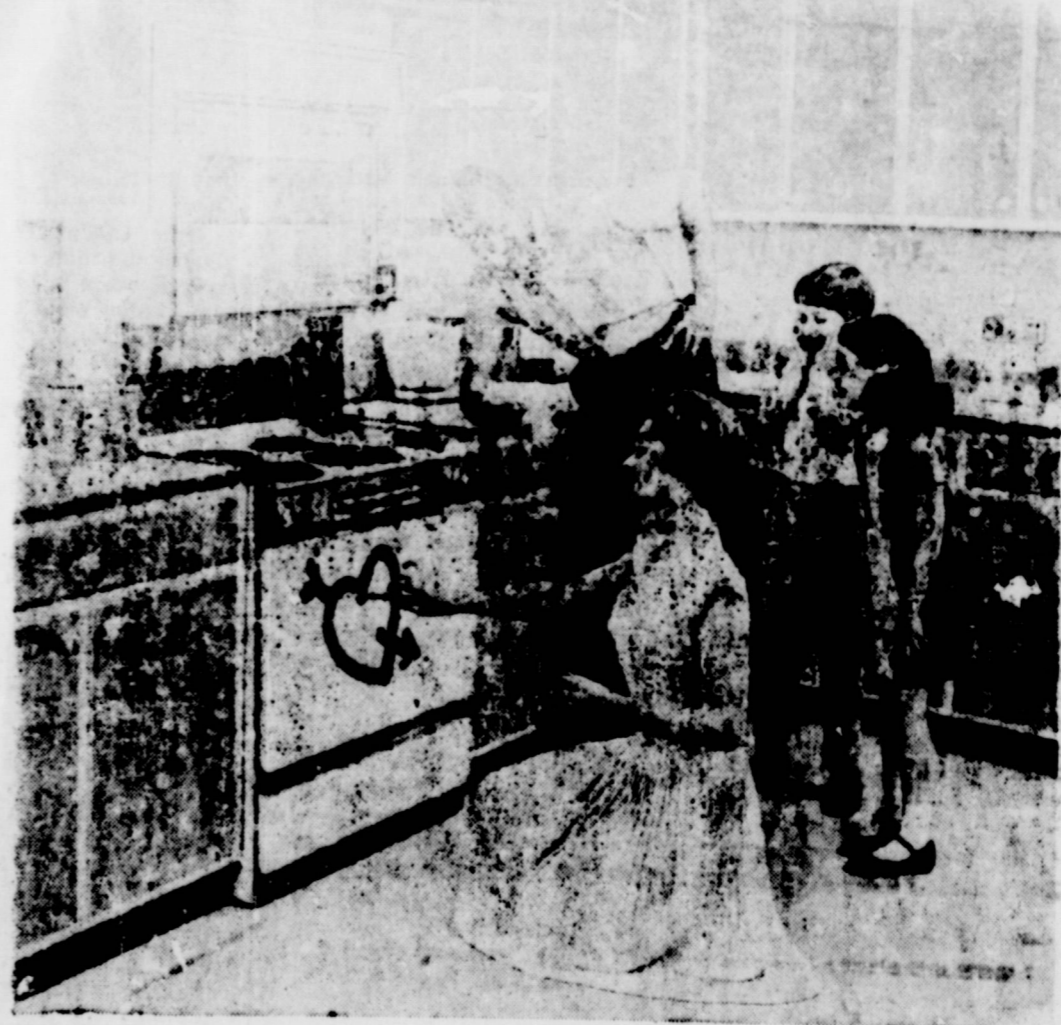

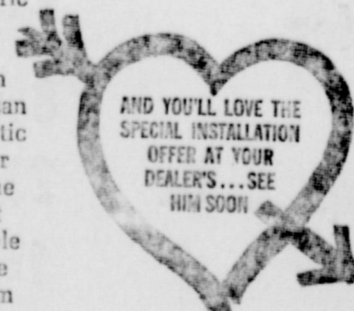

Highway 80 East RANGER

'Danger Spots' To Be Corrected In County In THDept. Program

Tentative plans are being made by the Texas Highway Department to spend near \$311 million as part of a continuing four-year war on traffic accidents, according to Resident Engineer R. P. (Buddy) Haun.

Estimated cost for correcting danger spots on highways in all parts of Texas is \$310,924,199. Of this total, an estimated \$179.3 million will be state funds and \$131.6 million, federal funds, which are derived from special taxes on highway users.

Federal funds programmed for District 23 total \$3,431,500; and federal funds let to contract (July 1, 1965 through March 31, 1966), \$291,586 bringing the total of federal

Eastland County, in District 23, is included in the plans. Total of state funds programmed is \$4,064,500; and state funds let to contract (July 1, 1965 through March 31, 1966), \$585,221, making a total of \$4,649,721.

Grand total of federal and state funds is \$8,372,807.

Projects listed by the bureau include the widening of narrow bridges and traffic lanes, reconstruction to increase sight distances on horizontal and vertical curves and installation of railroad crossing warning devices, traffic control devices including pavement markings, highway lighting, guardrails and fencing.
