question. He says: The establishment of prohibition in Chicago or other large cities would be im-practicable and would put a premium on the sale of intoxicating drinks.

"When a law is flagrantly and babitually violated it brings legislation into contempt. It creates a spirit of deception and hypocrisy, and compels men to do insidiously and by stenith what they would otherwise do open and above board. You cannot legislate men by civil action into the performance of good and righteous deeds."

Similar opinions have been publicly and privately voiced by thousands of other men, high in the councils of nation, state and church - who have the good of their fellow men sincerely at heart.

These men are clear thinkers. Their vision is unclouded by preudice. They foresee that prohibition does more than strike at the personal liberty of the people. They recognize it as a menace to

the stability of our institutions.
What Cardinal Gibbons says about prohibition in large cities is equally true of smaller cities and towns and of states. But the ill effects of prohibition are more far reaching than its encourage-




