"Thou Shalt Not Bear False Witness"

Colorado, Texas, June 6th, 1914.

Hon. Thomas L. Blanton, Abilene, Texas:

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter entitled: "Blanton Answers Smith", which article was also published in some of the papers.

From the title of the article or letter, I assume that your purpose was to attempt to reply to my open letter to you, recently published in a number of papers and distributed in circular form over the District.

Ten days have elapsed since that letter was placed in your hands; in that letter I mentioned twelve separate and distinct misrepresentations made by you, of my acts, since your announcement for Congress; I called your attention specifically to each of the twelve false statements made by you, and, in each instance, courteously requested an explanation, assuming that you desired to conduct your campaign upon an elevated and honorable plane, and one becoming an aspirant for the high office you seek at the hands of the people; upon that assumption, I naturally supposed that you would, when it was called to your attention, immediately explain and give those whose suffrage you seek, the truth.

And yet you have not attempted to explain; the only attention you have given the questions I asked you, so far as I have been advised, is in the above referred to letter sent to me and published in the Abilene "Reporter", in which letter you say:

"I will, for the present, withdraw all such charges "until we can meet each other in joint debate".

I have charged you with uttering falsehoods; I called your attention to them, and denounced them as false and untrue, and your only answer is that, for the present, you will withdraw all such charges. I again call upon you to make your charges good, each and every one, or else stand before the people of the District as a falsifier.

In your letter of June 1st, you mentioned only the misrepresentations in regard to Postmasters. In my open letter to you, I charged you with five other misrepresentations in questions Nos. 8. 9, 10, 11 and 12, not relating to recommendations of Postmasters: these you have absolutely ignored. Why? Be a man and answer them. or admit that the charges made by you are not true.

YOU DO NOT QUESTION A SINGLE VOTE I EVER CAST IN CONGRESS: I REFUSE TO DEBATE WITH YOU A QUESTION OF VERACITY; I HAVE CHARGED YOU WITH MISREPRESENTATIONS; YOU MUST EITHER PROVE YOUR ASSERTIONS OR RETRACT THEM. WHEN YOU HAVE DONE EITHER, THERE WILL THEN BE TIME ENOUGH TO TALK ABOUT A DEBATE BETWEEN US.

Many eminent divines who have made a close investigation of saloon conditions and the liquor question in general, declare that the moderate use of beer and light wines should be encouraged rather than discouraged, because they recognize the great truth that moderate indulgence is the only way by which true temperance can be promoted and lastingly maintained.

Rev. Dr. Parkhurst of New York, says:

"I am decidedly of the opinion that the more wine and beer there is produced in this country and the more freely it is transported from state to state, the less whiskey will be used and the smaller the amount of drunkenness."

Can, then, any right thinking person suppose that a light beer—a truly, healthful, mild and harmless beverage—is an enemy to mankind-that it can in any way be construed as the "curse of drink?" Yet the prohibitionists assert that it is and they would, therefore, abolish it. But in so doing they would but magnify the evil, drunkenness, they are trying to suppress. —Paid Advertisement.


