## 653 Register In This County

A total of 653 persons signed for a special voter registration in Eastland County, according to Tax Collector Edgar Altom.

Thursday, which was the last day to register, 154 registration certificates had been filled out, the last one coming in at 20 minutes before midnight, Mr. Altom said.

A total of 3,562 paid poll taxes, making the total "recorded" voting strength 4,215. The over-aged do not register in this county and their number is estimated at about 3,500 for a grand total of over 7,000.

## Cigaret Spark Blows Up 'Water Well' Gas

Shades of the old Desdemona oil boom days.

Four Desdemona men were taken to Blackwell Memorial Hospital in Gorman after learning late Thursday that the days of gas and oil production around here — once one of the wilder oil boom areas of the nation — are not over.

The four were testing what was supposed to be a 100-foot irrigation water well when accumulated gas exploded, burning all four on the faces and hands.

Rim Pack, one of the four injured men, said he had lighted a cigarette near the well head when the gas ignited.

Also hospitalized were Tommy Carr, L. E. Singleton and Joe Ben Koonce.

Volunteer firemen from Gorman extinguished the blaze after the blast occurred about 6:30 p. m. on the L. E. Singleton farm near Desdemona.

## Peanut Drying Plant Co-Op Appoints Temporary Directors

At a Monday night meeting, six temporary members were appointed to the board of directors of the newly forming co-op which will manage the proposed peanut drying plant in Cisco, said Jim Smothers, secretary of the project's steering committee.

Five more temporary members will be appointed to the board in the next few days. The six appointed Monday in the College Hotel Corral Room were Oscar Schaefer, chairman, Lee Starr, Gilmer Reese, Willis Parker, Jack Corant and G. A. Dunn Jr. of Rising Star.

A charter for the co-op will be applied for in the next few days. The board will draw up bylaws to be voted on by members at large.

The co-op will sell certified

stock at \$10 a share, Mr. Smothers said. Each agriculture producer may buy one share of common stock to permit himself one vote. In addition, an agriculture producer may purchase as many preferred stock as he wishes. Persons other than agriculture producers may purchase first preferred stock. Preferred stock will pay dividends.

The drying plant will have 24 drying units with 30 trailers, Mr. Smothers said. The warehouse will have a capacity of 2,000 tons. One feature of the drying plant will be a recleaning capability.

Approximately 25 attended the meeting Monday night. The temporary board of directors will convene as soon as the charter has been appointed.



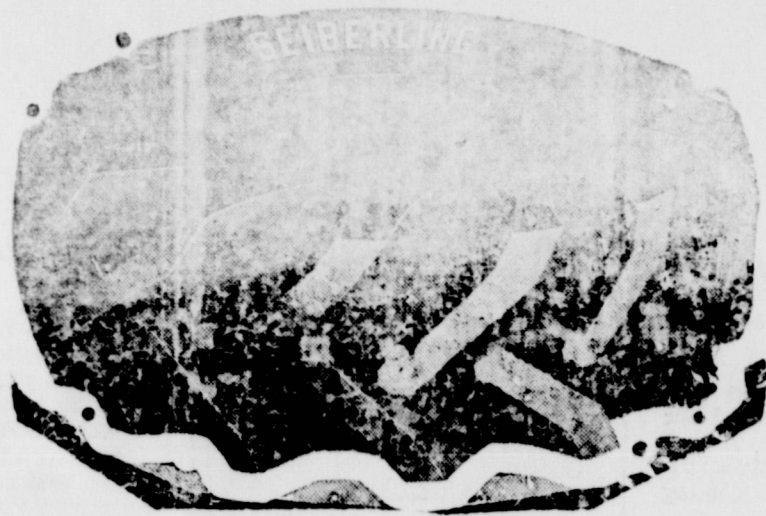


