LITTLE CHANGE SEEN IN NEW VOTING PLAN

Residents of cities with less than 10,000 population will have about the same regulations under the new state voter registration plan as under the poll tax system, according to Burke Musgrove of Breckenridge.

The new law, which will become effective if the Supreme Court upholds a ruling of a circuit court recently that the poll tax is not constitutional, was approved by both chambers of the Texas Legislature in Austin Tuesday.

Voters of Texas will have a 15-day registration period under the new legislation. This period will begin seven days after the bill is signed into law by Governor John Connally. This will likely be March 2 through March 16, Musgrove said.

The same poll tax forms will be used but stamped "conditional voter registration certificate." Registration by mail has been provided for and those over 60 years of age in cities of less than 10,000 inhabitants will not be re-

quired to register under the new legislation. The rest of the new procedure is basically the same as with the poll tax plan, Musgrove said.

Musgrove, candidate for the State Legislature in District 63 has been in Austin most of the time since the special session began to observe and report by telephone and news releases to the district. He talked with tax assessor-collectors in the five counties, including Edgar Altom of Eastland.

In response to questions of the tax men, Musgrove reported that the counties will have a net loss of 13 cents per registration under the new system. There will be no fees for registration but the state will allow each county a 25-cent fee for handling the job.

Under the registration plan, those otherwise qualified but failed to pay their poll tax by the Feb. 1 deadline will be able to vote in the April city and school elections as well as the primary in May, it was understood.

ANNIHILATION OF SCREW WORM AIM OF U. S. MEXICO PROJECT

The United States and Mexico have begun a joint research project aimed at control and eventual annihilation of the screwworm, according to John C. White, commissioner of the Texas Department of Agriculture.

White said the costly para-

site occurs widely throughout Mexico. This is substantiated by the submittal of 1,500 larvae by Mexican livestock producers as an initial sampling for the study.

The study is designed to determine the nature of the screwworm problem in Mexico with hopes that a new technique of controlling the cattle menace in Mexico as well as in the southwestern part of the United States.

Extensive programs aimed at eradications have had widespread success, White said, but sporadic outbursts still arise.

Past projects have been aimed at destroying the insects ability to reproduce. Eradication was accomplished by raising billions of screwworm flies, sexually sterilizing them, and releasing the insects throughout most of the southern United States.

White explained that the sterile flies would mate with native flies, but no offspring would be produced, thus destroying the insect's ability to multiply and spread.

The commissioner said to prevent screwworms from migrating into the United States from Mexico, eradication workers have been releasing sterile flies along the international border since 1962 to form a buffer zone.

Current studies will seek to determine if the program might be shortened and moved south across a narrower section of Mexico, while obtaining better results.

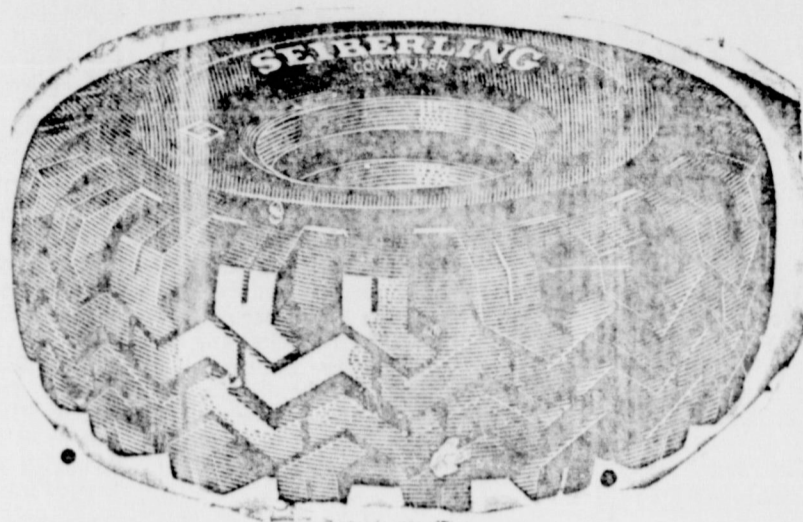

Region III State Historical Committee Will Meet March 19

Region III Texas State Historical Survey Committee will meet March 19 at the White Elephant Restaurant for noon luncheon and business meeting.

Eastland County will host the meeting.

On the host committee are Mike Collins, county chairman, and Mrs. Arthur Murrell, both of Eastland; Mrs. Alex Spears and County Judge

Scott Bailey, both of Cisco; Joe Dennis of Ranger; Gene Baker, of Gorman; Berry Greenwood of Carbon; and Mrs. W. A. Williams of Demonona.

U.S. Department of Agriculture began new tests with actual family washes.

This was done as part of long range research on survival of bacteria in home laundering, using both hot and cold water. Earlier studies indicated that large numbers of bacteria survive laundering with both hot and cold water.

In recent tests with cold water detergent, comparisons were made with and without disinfectants. The same concentration of disinfectants were used with cold water which proved effective with hot water.

With no disinfectant, far more bacteria survived in cold water than in hot water washes. When scientists added the appropriate amount of chlorine in the wash cycle, or quaternary disinfectants in the rinse, bacteria count was cut to 4 or less per square inch of fabrics at the end of the spin-dry-cycle — regardless of the water temperature.

When laundry was washed in cold water with a cold water detergent, on the other hand, the addition of phenolic or pine oil disinfectants in the wash cycle was relatively ineffective in reducing the bacteria level.

Water temperatures ranged from 57 to 64 degrees Fahrenheit during cold water laundering and 122 to 140 degrees Fahrenheit during hot water laundering.

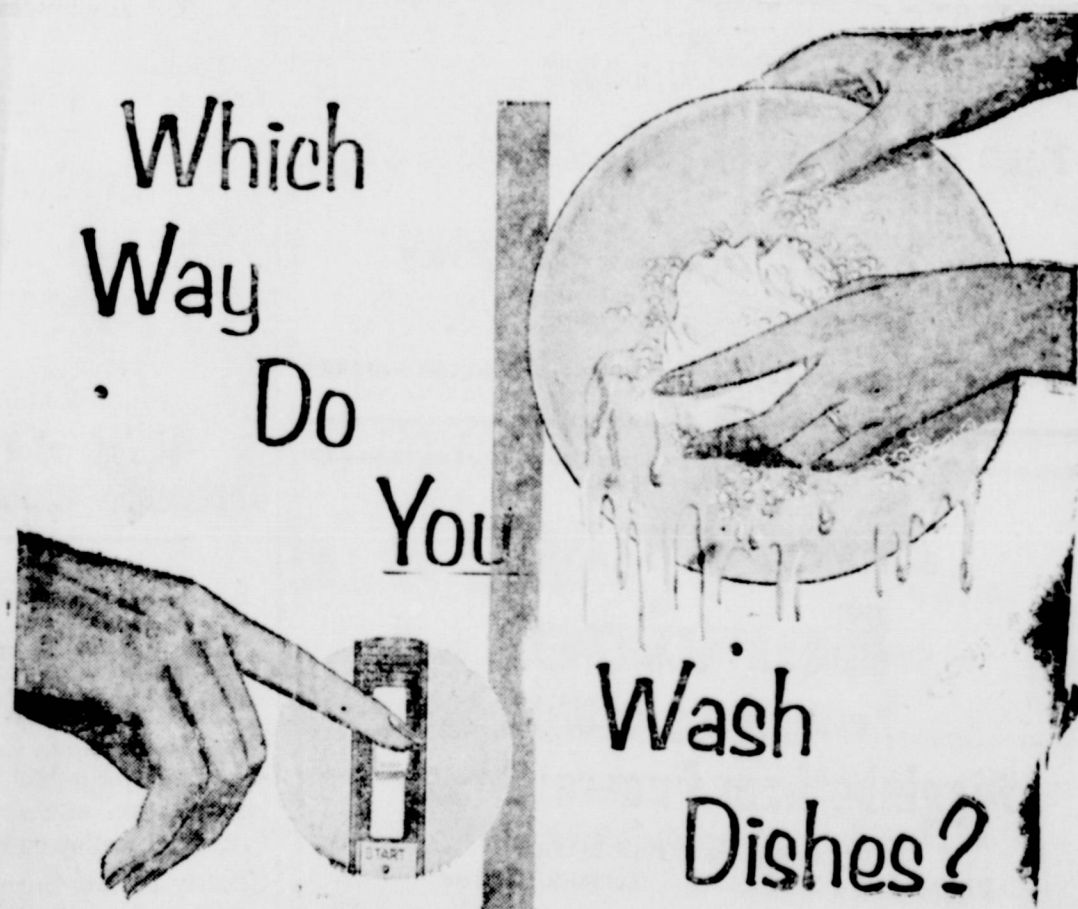

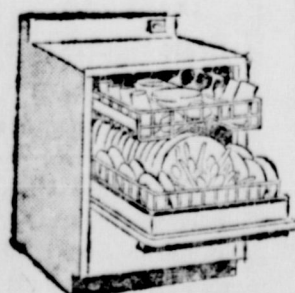
