Veniremen Get \$5 Now --\$4 Later

Special veniremen are getting a raise under the new criminal code — but ones to follow won't get as much as those who served in the trial this past week in 91st District Court.

The new code specifies that such potential jurors for murder trials will be paid "no less than \$4 per day and no more than \$10 per day," exact amount to be set by the County Commissioners Court.

The amount hadn't been established when the trial got underway Monday morning, so to be safe, the district clerk's office started paying the veniremen \$5 each when they appeared and were excused.

The commissioners court met later Monday however, and passed to following resolution which will put the special venire on a \$4 per day base.

"After due consideration it was determined by the court that the pay for special veniremen would be set at the sum of \$4 per day; the pay for grand jurors at the sum of \$5 per day; and the pay for petit jurors at the sum of \$5 per day. All commissioners voting "Aye" motion declared passed. It is further ordered that the amount for special veniremen would take affect

Over 500 Learn About Medicare In Talk Series

Over 535 Eastland Countians heard about "Medicare" in December and January. Fifteen talks were made by H. L. Weatherly, Field Representative, Social Security Administration, in all cities and communities in the county, plus all the Home Demonstration Clubs in the county.

These group meetings and talks were sponsored by the Eastland County Committee on Aging, H. V. O'Brien, Chairman; and by the Eastland County Home Demonstration Club Council, Beverly Nicholson, Home Demonstration Agent, J. M. Cooper, County Agent and member of the Committee, said the object of the meetings was to tell everyone in the county about Medicare.

Attending these meetings were the following number from towns in the county:

Ranger, 63; Cisco, 98; Eastland, 61; Carbon, 20; Rising Star, 21; Olden, 53; Nimrod, 43; Gorman, 31; and Desdemona, 10.

Forty applications were taken at the meeting and 145 cards were completed electing to take the medical portion of Medicare. One of the most profitable results of the talks was that all of the forty applications taken were from people who would have otherwise been missed. Many questions were answered on Medicare and other parts of Social Security.

At each of the meetings in the county, Weatherly explained the main points of Medicare: the one qualification to be eligible for this program is to be age 65 or older. It is divided into two parts, Hospital Insurance and Medical Insurance.

pay the bill when a person is hospitalized. When an individual enrolls the hospital he is responsible for the first \$40.00, and the balance (except for personal comfort items and private duty nurses) is paid by this program. All those who have qualified for Social Security or Railroad retirement benefits are automatically enrolled for this portion of the program. Everyone else needs to make an application. All those receiving Old Age Assistance are now being enrolled by the Department of Public Welfare; the rest need to contact the Social Security Office in Abilene or the representative when he is in their town. Hospital benefits do not cost the individual anything, but are to be paid from a special trust fund to which a part of current social security taxes are allocated.

Medical insurance helps to pay for the doctor's services and for some other medical items not under hospital benefits. This program pays 80 percent of the doctor bills after they amount to \$50.00 in a calendar year. The individual is responsible for the first \$50.00 of medical expense each year. This program is optional, so everyone who wishes to be under this part, must enroll for it. Those on Social Security or Railroad Retirement Benefits received a card from Baltimore in October or November, an enrollment card. When this was answered either "yes" or "no," no other action was necessary. If answered wrong, a new one can be obtained from the Social Security Office, Abilene Texas. Application for medical benefits is made as part of the application for hospital benefits. The deadline for making application for medical benefits for everyone born in 1900 and before is March 31, 1966. This protection costs \$3.00 per month, starting July 1, 1966.

Medicare becomes effective July 1, 1966.

The entire program was a series of successes because of the efforts of those on the Committee, who encouraged all interested Eastland County residents to attend the meeting most convenient for them.

An Eastland County peanut grower won state approval Tuesday to irrigate his 24-acre crop.

A. R. Townsend applied for a Texas Water Rights Commission permit to use 12-acre feet of water annually from an unnamed tributary of the South Fork of the Leon River. He told commission members that there was an existing reservoir.

Townsend said peanuts were grown on a 30-acre tract in Eastland County and that he wished to irrigate 24 of those acres. The permit was granted unanimously.

Gas Well Is Completed In Palo Pinto Area

Third gas well has been completed in the Johnston Gap (Atoka Conglomerate) Field three miles southwest of Metcalf Gap in Palo Pinto County.

It is Ben E. Taylor of Oklahoma City No. 2 Albert Riebe. Site is 1,300 feet from the north and 2,140 feet from the west lines of Section 59, Block 3, T&P Survey.

Calculated, absolute, open flow was seven million cubic feet of gas daily. It had a gas-liquid hydrocarbon ratio of 195-400-1 of 56.6 gravity.

The well is producing from perforations at 3,704-14 feet. The 4 1/2-inch casing is set at 3,920 feet, total depth.

A Palo Pinto Regular Field location was staked seven miles south of Palo Pinto. It is George J. Morgan, operating from Ranger, No. 2 Cyrus Holub.

Having a proposed depth of 4,000 feet, it spots 660 feet from the north and 1,100 feet from the east lines of Section 60, Block 2, T&P Survey.

Jarbe Oil Co., Houston, filed application to recenter to 1,750 feet with rotary an Eastland County regular Field project three miles east of Eastland.

It is No. 1-A A. J. Pippen, originally drilled by W. M. Jarrell. Location is 200 feet from the north and 767 feet from the east lines of Section 4, Block 6, ETRR Survey.
