Pecan Show Is Set For Dec. 10-11

The 13th annual Eastland County Pecan Show will be held in Cisco on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 10-11, according to an announcement Friday by Oscar Schaefer of Cook, president of the county Pecan Growers Association. Details for the show were worked out at meetings Monday night in Eastland and Thursday night at the Chamber of Commerce in Cisco. The show will be sponsored jointly by the county association and the Cisco CoC. The CoC agriculture committee will handle local details.

Sheriff Dept. Is Tear-Gas Equipped

There's going to be "tears ahead" for certain Eastland County law breakers now.

The county sheriff's department is equipped with a tear-gas rig which can, when called on, lay down an enormous atmosphere of uncomfortable breathing material for violators.

The rig consists of a long-range weapon capable of hurling a tear-gas projectile up to some 350 yards, shorter range weapons and tear-gas grenades.

To be kept at the county jail and available for use by all law enforcement agencies in the area, the device is expected to be most usable here for the routing out of holed-up persons in vacant buildings when there's danger of personal injury from mental patients or others capable of inhuman acts.

The rig costs approximately \$300, and the county also added to the sheriff department two road-block type beacon lights, red-block signs for the autos and miniature two-way radios.

The tear-gas gun is a shotgun-type device which can accurately hurl gas bombs through windows and openings at great distances.

IH 20 Project Begins In Cisco Area Monday

Work will begin early this week on a 5.6 mile section of Interstate 20 (Highway 80) from just west of Cisco to the Walter Kurklin farm three miles east of town, according to information at a briefing session held Thursday at the city hall.

The meeting was arranged by County Highway Engineer R. P. (Buddy) Haun and those present included District Engineer E. M. Pritchard of Brownwood, contractors, city officials, police and patrolmen and others.

Some 50 men will be employed on the project at peak periods, it was reported. Plans of the Acme Bridge Co. and M. E. Ruby Jr., Inc., the contractors, call for hiring all common labor locally. Their skilled workers, including machine operators, will move here for the job, which will require seven to nine months.

The two firms were awarded the contract for grading and structures on the route for the sum of \$1,140,300.98. Bridges and overpasses will be built and the 370 foot wide right-of-way will be leveled and prepared for paving in a later project.

Mr. Haun noted that the area of most danger to traffic was the point of intersection of IH 20 and the Rising Star Highway at the end of Avenue D. He said that temporary detours of some 1500 feet would be put up at the appropriate time. He noted that the various streets intersecting the IH 20 route might be closed during the work.

Hugh Holland of Acme Bridge Company and Maurice Ruby of the Ruby firm were present for the briefing. A

39,766 Families Are Given Help By Rural Agency

Over 39,766 families of Farmers, ranchers and rural residents in Texas benefitted from Farmers Home Administration loan services during 1965. This is an all-time high, according to L. J. Cappelman, state director for the agency. Loans made or insured by the Farmers Home Administration in Texas during the fiscal year ended June 30 total a record \$88,289,230.

State Director Cappelman said that the Farmers Home Administration preserved its long-standing record for keeping its various lending programs in a sound position during fiscal 1965. Repayments of principal and interest by borrowers totaled the largest volume collected in the agency's 30-year history.

"This good credit record signifies the initiative and inte-

grity displayed by the people of rural Texas in their vast self-help effort which these loans represent," Cappelman stated.

Included in the number of Texas rural people benefitting from these programs are the members of 28,245 families forming rural groups that use Farmers Home Administration credit. Most of these groups borrowed funds to develop rural community water systems.

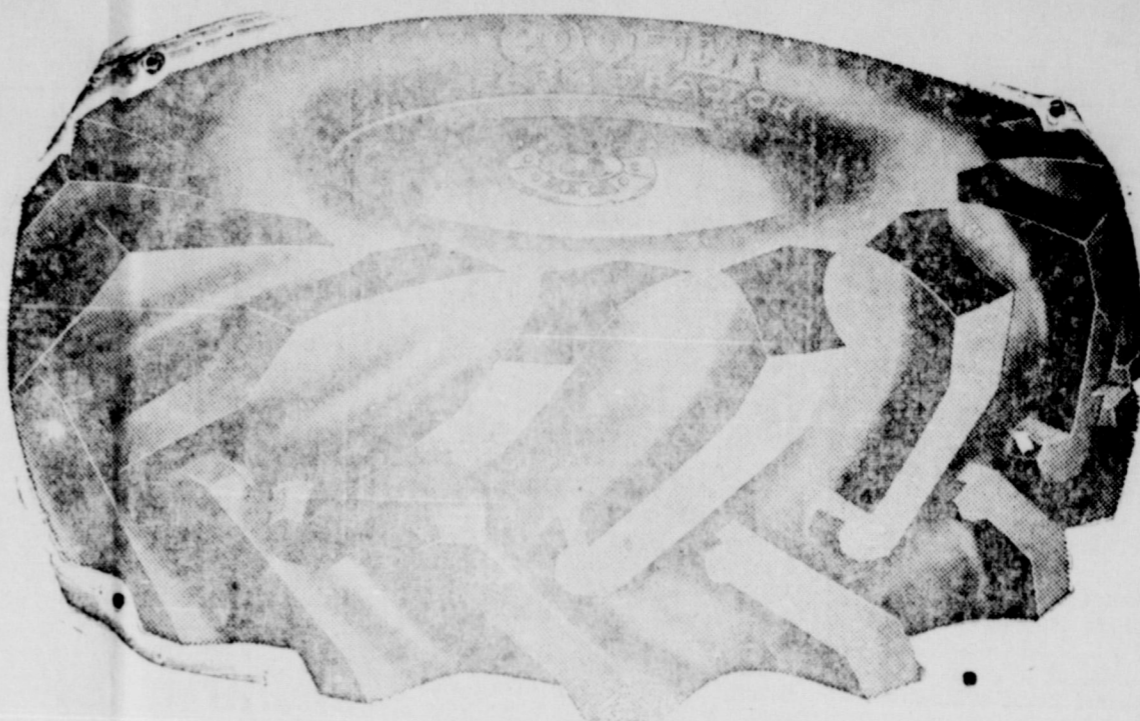
State Director Cappelman emphasized that loans to strengthen family farms and build new rural homes continued as the agency's largest program in fiscal 1965.

Game Warden's Jobs Open for Young Texans

AUSTIN, Oct.—That sturdy youth pursuing fall outdoor sports with more than ordinary zeal, perhaps just a little taller in the saddle, may have a different role come next fall. He could be one of the young men the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department is counting on for the annual new warden class which, some time before late summer rains cool and reinvigorate the parched earth, will assume their new positions as full-fledged Texas game wardens.

Active interest in the outdoors naturally is a requisite for the applicants since a major portion of their routine will be in some form of wildlife contact, said J. B. Phillips, law enforcement co-ordinator.

"But a modern warden no longer is confined to the actual wildlife harvest routine," said Phillips. "Rather, he works it from both ends. He works on wildlife management details and, through con-

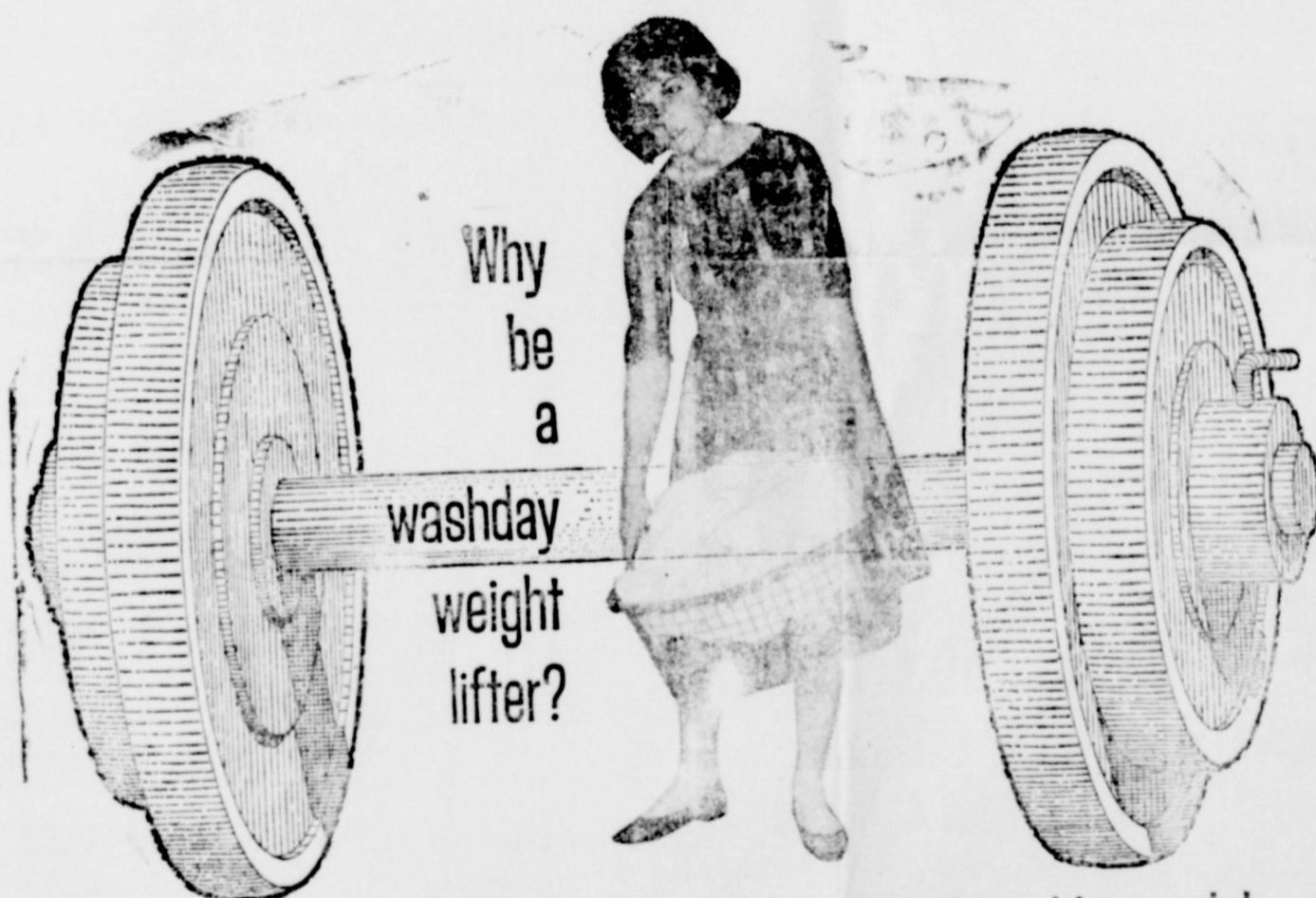
