A gas well has been completed four and one-half miles northeast of Ranger in the Eastland County Regular Field, the Texas Railroad Commission reported Monday. It is Texzona Petroleum Inc. of Ranger No. 2 M. L. Woods, 350 feet from the north and 940 feet from the west lines of W. F. Davis Survey, A-112. Absolute, open flow was 60 000 cubic feet of dry gas daily from an open hole at 3,270-97 feet in the Marble Falls.

Two men from India will be observing the work of the Soil Conservation Service in Eastland County for two weeks, reports Irvin Poff, area conservationist, Soil Conservation Service.

Arun Kumar Dutta, Assistant Soil Conservation Officer, Calcutta, India, arrived in Eastland Tuesday, where he will observe Local Manager E. E. McAlister and the local SCS staff until Sept. 16. Then he will go to Stephenville for a week.

Narayan Kashinathji Shende, Assistant Soil Survey Officer, Nagpur, India will be in Stephenville until Sept. 16, when he will come to the Eastland County office for study until Sept. 24.

Messrs. Dutta and Shende have previously had training at Washington, D. C., South Dakota, Nebraska and California, and will go from here to Fort Worth, South Carolina, Georgia and Ohio before returning to Washington and then home.

They are particularly interested in the activity of Soil Scientists of the area, as they will be in charge of Soil Survey operations when they return to India in November. In Eastland County, they will work closely with Edward R. Harris, soil scientist for the local SCS office, learning about the survey process. Mr. Harris recently joined the Eastland staff and is in the process of a two-year survey of the entire county soil status.

The Indians' objective is to gain additional field experience in soil surveys and their use in watershed and farm planning, Mr. McAlister said.

Mr. Poff stated, "We welcome the opportunity to assist them in becoming familiar with our ways of conservation. We have had very good experience in the past in work with such foreign representatives."

The foreign guests will stay at the Village Hotel during their stay in Eastland.

Convicts Take The Glory Out Of 'Easy Life' For Youngsters Of County

"Don't despise the simple things of life."

our pattern of behaviour — That was the stern advice to Eastland County youngsters from inmates of the Texas state penitentiary during "Operation Teenager" in Eastland Friday morning.

More than 2,000 public school and junior college students sat in wide-awake wide-eyed awe as three convicts told their own life stories and sounded warnings for those who sat free outfront. Many of the teenagers wept openly as the tales of broken homes, broken hearts and broken lives were unfolded.

The three anonymous inmates gave no outward sign of their hard, cruel lives as they appeared in their spotless, freshly-ironed white uni-

forms, looking for all the world like "the boy next door. Neither was over 21 years of age, but the total of their sentenced time amounts to 271 years, it was announced.

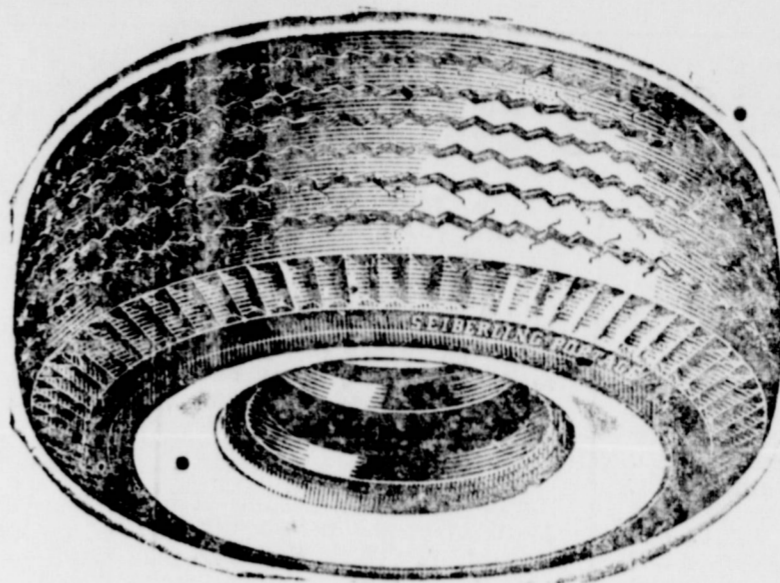
On stage at the Majestic Theater they appeared as they do at what they now call their "home", only with numbers, no identity. No one told of coming from a large family and drifting into the wrong crowd.

No. Two was from a wealthy family, wanted for nothing, and sought only after the "easy" life of no work, no study and no responsibilities.

No. Three told about his search for popularity at the expense of all other qualities.

Neither of the three listed a goal, and in the summation, cited that omission as one

of the reasons they are where they are today.

"We are not where we are because of an accident. It didn't happen all of a sudden. We are what we are and where we are because of established when we were like you."

Advising the youngsters to enjoy the simple things, the convicts said that these were the things that they miss most now — a quiet evening at home with the family, a hill, a walk down a street with a friend and the good feeling of having self respect.

"The least important to us now are the things we used to think were the most important — fast cars, hot dates and high living."

Introducing the program was County Judge Scott Bailey, who also introduced Becky Nowlin of Rising Star and Rhett Smith of Eastland, who represented their respective towns at the state attorney general's youth conference.

Convict-made gavels were presented by Miss Nowlin to Julia Watkins, president of the Rising Star Student Council and by Smith to High School Principal Chas. Marshall — to symbolize the school's participation in the youth conference.

A fourth convict was scheduled to appear, but Larry Williams, Texas Department of Corrections representative who accompanied the convicts said that he "had gone home."

Without a wasted word and in an articulate manner as one could imagine, the young men spelled out their stories during the two programs. Their well-measured words dramatically gave insight to an impressive program for area youth.

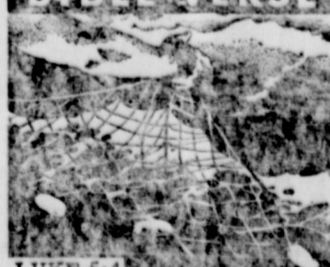

Those entering Livestock were Larry, Jerry, and Lynn Williamson of Ranger; Scott and Becky Miller of Morton Valley; Frank Claborn of Eastland; Mike and Bill Farnsworth and Brit Ferguson of Cisco; and Cynthia and Carter Hounsel of Rising Star.

In the open Hampshire sheep division, Brit Ferguson had the third place pen of three ram lambs, third place ewe lambs, and a first and third 2-4 tooth ewes. He had the Grand Champion Hampshire ewe of the Junior show. Bill Farnsworth had fourth place 2-4 tooth ewe in the open division, and a second place 2-4 tooth ewe in the Junior division.

In the open Southdown classes, Frank Claborn had the fifth place ram lamb, the third place pen of three ewe lambs, the second place Get-of-Sire and third place exhibits flock. Scott Miller of Morton Valley had the second place ewe lamb in the open show.
