We are taking the liberty of putting into effect commencing April 12th, 1920, which we believe will be satisfactory to every one concerned the following service: Monday morning we will pick up all work on the north, west and east sides, Monday afternoon, pick up all work on South side and answer calls over the entire city.

Wednesday morning, pick up all work in the City. Wednesday afternoon, deliver all work received Monday and answer calls in the City. Friday evening and Saturday morning deilver work received Wednesday.

Family wash or Rough Dry: This includes all mixed bundles such as wearing apparel and linens. This includes straight wearing bundles but not straight linen bundles. In order to induce our customers old as well as new to send us more rough dry work and to prove that we can do this work more economically and more satisfactorily and superior to that done by your present wash woman and to relieve the house wife of all wash day troubles we are establishing the following prices to be effective Monday April 12th, 1920. Our present price for the above class of work is 10 cents per pound. Our new price will be, the first 10 pounds for 75c, which will be the minimum charge, that is no bundle at this rate will be accepted for less than 75 cents. All bundles over 10 lbs will be accepted at the rate of 7 1-2 cents per pound All the above is washed and all starched pieces will be starched and delivered ready for ironing.

Linen Bundles: All linen bundles which is a straight linen bundle containing no wearing appearel will be at the rate of 8c pe rpound. All linen in either case will be ironed.

The following appeared in a trade journal, A housewife speaking! to another lady in regard to laundry work made the following remark. "By all means send your bundle to the laundry the first of the week as during the latter part of the week your bundle will be washed in the dirty suds from the first of the week" Dear friends, such is not the case and it matters not whether your bundle comes in the first part or the latter part of the week, your work goes through the following process of washing.

All bundles after being properly marked are seperated, dark from light, blacks and dark browns separate, and linen from wearing appearel and very dirty and greasy from soiled, loaded into machine, and washed as follows: Cold water rinse 10 minutes, water discharged. Warm suds 25 to 30 minutes, water discharged, boiling suds 25 to 30 minutes, water discharged, hot rinse 5 minutes, water discharged, cold water sufficient to float clothes blue. discharge water, and wring clothes. So you readily see there is no logic in the above remark and instead of your clothes being washed in dirty suds they are washed in six different waters, every operation containing from 25 to 35 gallons of water each and consumes from 1 hour 20 minutes to 1 hour 30 minutes for each load. Its the amount of water and time consumed that makes your clothes look so clean and white and wear longer. It would give us much pleasure to have you, one and all inspect our plant and work, and you are welcome at all times to do so.

#### VIEWS OF WM. C. HOLDEN

When a man announces for public office, outside the fact that he is an honest man, people are most concerned in what he stands for. Wm. C. Holden, candidate for representative, 121st district, stands for the following issues.

1. Stringent legislation that will save the state school system. Few people realize what a serious problem the schools are facing. There are this year 1000 schools and calss rooms vacant on account of lack of teachers. indications are that next year there will be no less than 5000 vacancies and 10,000 of these who will remain in the profession will be incompetent teachers. Furthermore, the term must be cut down to secure these. Something must be done to save the school system and done before it is further wrecked.

2. Re-districting Western Texas. At the present we are not receiving the representation we are entitled to The interest of this section has grown to such extent we must have our prorata of representation.

3. West Texas A. & M. College. The location of which shall be settled in the Legislature.

4. A slight reform in the tax system, whereby the county renditions for state taxation purposes shall be fixed by a State board of equalization, in accordance to a uniform scale as to the real valuation of the respective counties under the present hap-hazard system, the state accepts whatever rendition the different counties choose to render. Some counties have a high valuation, some low. The state assesses all alike. As a result those counties who have high valuations are carrying the burden of state taxation. As a rule the western counties have high renditions and some of the eastern counties low renditions. This means that we people who have high valuations are paying the fidler while some one else is do. ing the dancing. For every \$1.80 paid to the State for school purposes in this county, we get back from the state \$1.00. There are certain counties in the rich black land belt who receive from the State \$3.00 for every \$1.00 they pay as taxes. Elementary justice demands that an adjustment be made whereby we may reeeive at full value that which we are entitled to.
