REPORT TO <br> THE SCHOOL BOARD. <br> Colorado, Tesxas, April 5, 1920 <br> To the Honorable School Board of Coloracio. <br> Gentlemen:- <br> Your attention is hereby directed to the following report of the Colorado Schools for the month ending April 2, 1920. <br> Enrollment by grades is given herein. <br> In white school 296 . 334 Practically all the State text-books have arrived of the first requisition that was made last June, but owing to the large enrolment that was not expected, we have had to make emergeney orders for several different books. <br> Several months ago we sent out orders for library books for both high school and grades. These books have been coming in'a few at a time for two or three months. We have quite a number of new maps, paid for out of the library fund, and they are proving to be a very great help in teaching history, geography, and Latin. <br> We have recently received a fine compound mieroscope, which adds very materially to the physicology equipment. <br> Your attention is called to the fact that there are pupils in the school who are failing to do the work required, and yet who could do the work easily if their interest could be arroused. Quite a number are failing we believe solely because of indifference on the part of the pupil and farent. Some parents permit their children to attend shows, parties,and other social functions during week nights when these same pupils should be at home preparing the school work | for the rext day. It is almost impossible for the teacher to arrouse an interest in the pupil for school work without the hearty, everyday coopeartion of the parent, and it seems impossible to get this from some parents. Children are permitted to stay out of school for several days at a time for frivolous reazons. Right at this point I should like to recommend that a stricter enforcement of the compalsory attendance law should maintain in this distriet. I am almost convinced that very few people know that there is such a law applieable to Cclorado children. Of course it is hoped that these indifferent ones may change from indifference to interest in time to save some of these children who should do the work of their grades well, but who are not do. ing it. Keport cards are sent to the parent at the end of every school nonth and if the parents of the children who are failing do not know it, it is not the school's fault. <br> For the month which ended March 5 , we had one hundred and thirteen cases of tardiness. For the month just endsd, we have to report sixtythree cases of tardiness. The last showing, while better than that of the month before, is not $=$ good one. The weather has been good and there should have been only a very few tardies. This is an evidence of the indifferenes of some patrons and some children. These tardies are usually the ones that are failing. <br> The seniors recently purchased window shades for the windows of the laboratory room. They bought eight shades at a cost of three dollars each.
