





Wheareas, by satisfactory evidence presented to the undersigned, it has been made to appear that "The City National Bank of Colorado, in the city of Colorado, County of Witchell, and State of Texas, has complied with all provisions of the Art of Congress "to enable National Banking Associations to extend their corporate existence, and for other purposes," approved July 12, 1882:

Now, therefore, J. Thomas P.
