ASCS Convention To Be Sept. 22

The County Convention, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, will be held on Sept. 22, at which time county committeemen will be elected, according to J. G. Meredith, county ASCS office manager.

Another election, for the purpose of choosing community committeemen, was held on last Wednesday.

32,000 Acres Planted in Peanuts In This County, ASCS Chief Reports

Eastland County has a potential of \$2,220,000 income from its peanut crop this year — "if we get a good rain soon" — Gilbert Meredith, local manager for the Agricultural Stabilization Conservation committee, told the e Eastland Lions Club Tuesday.

His office reports that 32,-035,.5 acres are planted this year, he said, and with an average yield of 21 bushels (last year's yield) and an average price of \$3.30 (some higher, some lower), the net income should exceed \$2 million, he said.

Number of acres planted is up considerable from last year, he pointed out, and if

Tuesday's Vote Cost \$875.84

There is hope that all the action of the state senate is not as expensive as last Tuesday's constitutional amend ment election.

If you were among the few in Eastland County who voted, your ballot cost the county about \$1.40, according to figures tabulated at weeks end. Had more people voted the per vote average would have been less, of course.

In all, the election cost the

county \$375.85 and there were only 603 votes cast. The total cost includes \$706.50 for election clerks, \$92 for printing of ballots and \$77.34 for election supplies, bought from an Austin firm.

Box by box, here's the clerk cost: Eastland, \$78; Olden, \$55 (includes \$5 for rent of a voting site); Ranger, \$101; Carbon, \$32; Goramn, \$57; Desdemona, 36.50; Kokomo, \$35; Pioneer, \$79; Rising Star, \$46; Cisco, \$128; Scranton, \$35; and Nimrod, \$24.

According to a report, the 59th session of the State Senate passed 783 bills and resolutions of 1,906 considered. Describing the peanut economy here, he said there are 5,400 "patches" of peanuts with some 950 to 1,000 peanut allotments, on the some 2,454 farms. The county has some 163,000 acres of cropland, and some 347,000 acres of non-cropland. Of the total number of farms, some 950 have peanut allotments, 1,250 have feed grain allotments,

240 have wheat allotments, and only 275 now have cotton allotments.

Purpose of the ASCS is to conserve and build natural resources; to imporve and protect farm incomes; to attempt to keep the supply equal to demand; and to provide food and fiber to the consumer at fair prices, Meredith said. The county has the capacity to produce some 60,000 acres of peanuts, he

New SS Law To Send More Cash To County


The first noticeable effect in Eastland County of the 1965 Amendments to the Social Security Act, signed into law on July 30 by President Johnson, will be the receipt of some \$136,986 in extra benefit checks, due about the middle of September, according to R. R. Tuley, Jr., District Manager of Social Security in Abilene. The checks arriving October 3 will be in the new amounts, totalling some \$269,592 for Eastland County.

"That sum represents the 7 per cent increase in benefits for the months of January-August", he added, "and will go to some 4,356 residents of Eastland County who are now receiving monthly social security checks by reason of age, disability, or the death of a parent or spouse."

Present beneficiaries will get that increase automatically ,and need not write or con-

Tuley believes the next early effect will be the securing of claims applications on behalf of unmarried students between 18 and 22 years of age who can be paid monthly benefits on the records of a deceased, disabled, or aged parent, who was insured under social security. The new law provides that these benefits will also be retroactive to January of 1965, but a formal claim will be needed as will evidence of regular school attendance. The school may be high school or college; if college, it must be either state supported, accredited by a state or national body, or its credits must be acceptable by transfer to such an institution. Those students who previously received social security benefits to age 18, will not need to prove their age





Dove Hunt Spans 120 Part Days

AUSTIN - Texans will have a total of 120 half days to pursue the popular sport of dove hunting this year. Many other states have only 60 full

The season set by the Tex-as Parks and Wildlife Commission provides a substantial bonus for white-winged dove hunters in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas. This year, a full limit of mourning dove is permitted in addition

to the limit of whitewings. For mourning doves, the daily limit is 12 and 24 in possession (after the first For whitewings, the daily limit is 10 and 20 in posses-

sion (after the first day). Dates for the white-winged dove season which attracts gunners from as far away as New York City, are Saturday and Sunday, September 4 and 5, and Saturday and Sunday, September 11 and 12. Shooting hours are from noon to sunset.

On mourning doves, the season is the same as last year in the north zone. Dates are September 1 through October 30, and the south zone from September 25 through November 23 except in those counties having a whitewing sea-son where it will be September 25 through November 19. Shooting hours are from noon to sunset.

AUSTIN — Lieutenant Governor Preston Smith announced the appointment of Senator Tem Creighton of Mineral Wells to the interin. Election Law Study Committee.

Bobby Rivers Is New Patrolman In This Region

Highway Patrollman Bobby Chester Rivers, formerly of Brownwood, has joined the Eastland County Highway Patrol force, moving to Eastland Monday, Aug. 30.

Being a patrollman for the past five and a half years, Rivers spent the past two years patrolling in Brownwood and the three and a half years preceding, in Canyon.

He is a 1955 graduate of Rotan High School. In '57, he joined the Army, did overseas duty and was discharged in '59. During 1961, when the 49th Division, called for "fillers," he was drafted, and was stationed with the Eastland-Cisco-Ranger Unit.

Patrollman Rivers and his wife, Barbara have three sons Bobby Ross 7, Bradley 2, and Bruce six weeks old. The family resides at 305 Neblett Street.

Avery Island, near New Iberia, Louisiana, has a salt mine underground and raises peppers above ground for Tabasco sauce - hence is called the "salt and pepper island."

The Cisco Dam

The Cisco Dam, completed in 1924, is a haven for the love-lorn, the curious, the adventuresome, the dare-devil, the tourist, and bats of all

sizes. For forty years it has stood as a monument to the City of Cisco. This dam, known as the Amburson type, cost two and a quarter million dollars; quite an ambitious undertaking for a city of only 10,000 people.

The dam impounds a lake with a capacity of some 20 billion gallons of water. It is located in the scenic hilly section three miles north of Cisco, on what is known as Big Sandy Creek. In 1924 U.S. Highway 283 passed over the top of the dam at a height of 125 feet from the lowest point of the lake bed. It was computed to be one of the highest vehicular bridges in the state, as well as being the only hollow dam in the entire United States at the time of its construction.

It has three levels of catwalks. Two are still in good shape today, but the third is condemned because some of its guard rails are missing, leaving no protection at all against becoming overbalanced in the total darkness and falling many feet to backwater and what would be certain death. It is supposedly closed off to the public now and has been for some years, but the upper and the lower levels on the eastern side of dam are still open for all to walk through, day or night. The only restriction is the prohibiting of firearms and tireworks,

The foundation of the dam required an excavation of 125,-000 cubic yards. The foundation rests on limestone. The dam itself is 1,190 feet in length, is 125 feet high at spillway and contained 90,000 cubic yards of concrete and 2,000,000 pounds of re-enforc-ing steel. The re-enforcement is designed to bear a maximum stress of 15,000 pounds per square inch with a maximum stress in concrete of 550 pounds per square inch.

The slabs which retain the water have a thickness of eight and one-half feet at the base, graduating to 18 inches at the top. Expansion joints are located at intervals of 72 feet, each joint copper flashed with a strip 32 inches wide from top to bottom. Each strip is folded and cast separately into the concrete, rendering the dam waterproof.

Below the dam there is a recreational area, centered about two concrete swimming pools with an overall length of 700 feet and a width of 300 feet. Camping and picnic area, adequate for a large or small group, is just what a party needs for relaxing after the half-mile hike round-trip through the Lake Cisco Dam.
