VETS QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Q — A veteran is requested
to report to the Veterans Administration for a physical
examination in connection

examination for a physical examination in connection with his claim for compensation. En route, he is killed in an automobile accident. Is service connection in order inasmuch as the veteran was reporting to the VA for a scheduled examination?

A - No. There are no provisions for rating such injuries or death service-connected under these circumstances.

Q — Am I entitled to care in a VA hospital if all my service was in peacetime?

A — A peacetime veteran may be admitted to a VA hospital if he receives service-connected disability compensation, was discharged or retired for disability incurred in line of duty, or has been awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Q — A veteran applies for and is granted a loan on his GI insurance. After receiving the check, he changes his mind, does not cash the check, but returns it to the VA Insurance Center and requests cancellation of the

loan. Why must the veteran pay interest charges on the loan under those conditions when the check was returned uncashed within thirty days from date of issue?

A — There is no authority to cancel the loan, and interest must be charged in some amount. If the veteran returns the check uncashed, the VA must return it to him with a statement that he may endorse it and return it to the Veterans Administration as payment on the loan, and to this will be added some interest charge.







Changes In Marine Corps Enlistment Policies Made

The United States Marine Corps made some changes in their present enlistment programs August 11.

The Marine Corps is now accepting applications for twoyear and three-year assignments to extend active duty.

Persons enlisting under this program may choose a date of departure for active duty within 60 days of the date of enlistment.

To be eligible for this program, persons with no prior military service must be 18years of age and at least 62 inches in height.

In addition, former Marines with the rank of Gunnery Sergeant or below, if otherwise qualified, who were released from active service within the past 12 months, may be enlisted in the regular Marine Corps and re-appointed to the rank held at the time of their discharge or release from active duty.

Also, former members of the armed forces with not more than one dependent, who are eligible for appointment to the

rank of Private First Class (E-2) or Lance Corporal (E-3) are acceptable for enlistment in the Marine Corps if other wise qualified.

Persons interested in obtaining information about any Marine Corps programs should check with the Marine Corps Recruiter at Post Office Building, downtown Abilene, Texas.
