Preparation Underway For Sept. 7 Election

Writs of election are being served by County Judge Scott Bailey for the Sept. 7 election, for the purpose of deciding whether or not to raise the number of State senators from 31 to 39. If the bill doesn't pass, eight senators will have to run against each other in the next election, the Judge stated.

The bill being voted on reads as follows: "Proposing an amendment to sections two and 25, Article III to provide for increase in membership of State Senate from 31 to 39 members; to fix membership of House of Representatives at 150 members; to require apportionment of the Senate according to population, and to delete limitation on that no single county is entitled to more than one senator.

250 Attend Desdemona Celebration

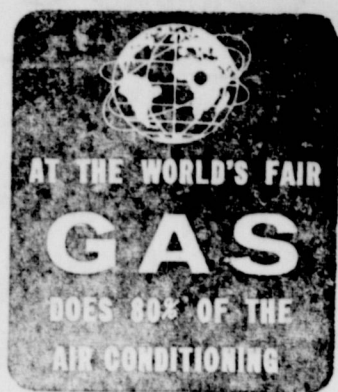
Some 250 persons were present for the Desdemona Homecoming activities at the Community Tabernacle Saturday, it was reported.

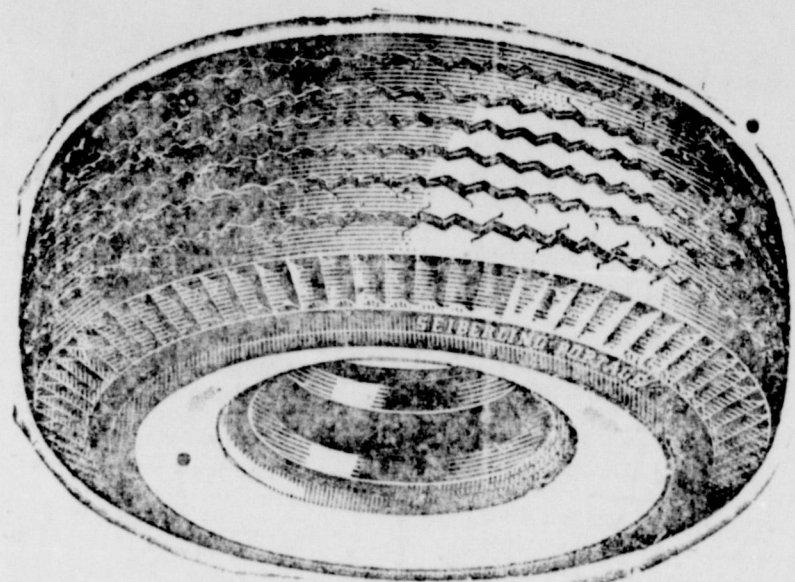

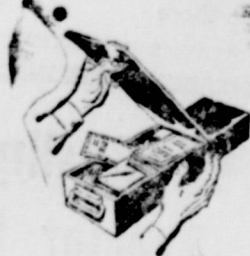

Nonfat dry milk is the powdered form of skim milk. It is convenient to store on the pantry shelf, safe to tote on warm weather outings, easy to use at a moment's notice, and usually is a "best buy" for the economy-minded shopper.

When reconstituted with water, it too can be used in place of whole milk. Or, add the powder to a recipe, along with other dry ingredients, and add water with other liquids. Try instant nonfat dry milk in your own Pancake Mix.

This is a dry mix that you can prepare ahead of time and keep in a tightly covered container until used. For mix that will make 10 to 12 pancakes, you'll need 1 1/2 cups flour, 3 tablespoons sugar, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 cup instant nonfat dry milk. Sift together the flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt. Then mix in the dry milk and put in tight container until you want to use it.

To make the pancakes, add 1 1/2 cups water, 2 eggs and 3 tablespoons melted butter. Combine the water, eggs and butter, add mix and blend well. Pour about one-third cup batter for each pancake onto hot buttered griddle. When bubbles appear, turn and bake other side. Serve with butter, syrup, apple-sauce, cottage cheese or other toppings.

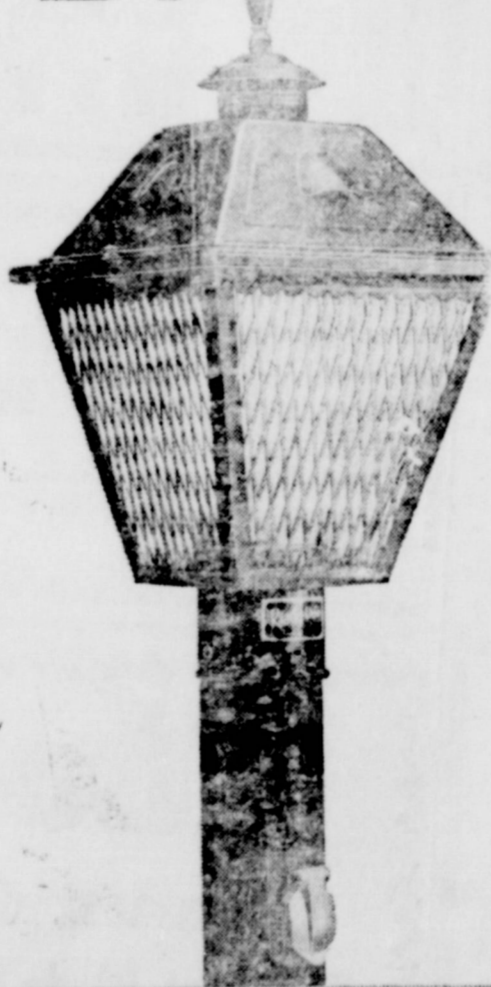

Highway Patrol Ready For Labor Day Traffic

 Operation Morticide will be conducted as a special emphasis program to combat carelessness and traffic law violation during the Labor Day weekend from 12:01 a.m., September 4, through 11:59 p. m. September 6th, according to Sergeant Roger Sosebee of the Department of Public Safety of this department.

Sosebee said that he will have 14 men on patrol during the Labor Day holiday. The days will include Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The patrolmen will be on the regular routine patrol during the holiday.

According to Sosebee, last year there were 22 accidents in this area. There was one fatal accident which took the lives of two people. There were nine accidents where injuries were reported with 13 people being hurt. There were 12 accidents that were recorded as property loss.

In this immediate area the main factors which cause the majority of the accidents are failing to give right-of-way, driving on the wrong side of the road, speeding, and the driving while intoxicated violation.

On the Texas scene the traffic violations that will contribute to the majority of the 25 traffic deaths over the Labor Day weekend will be what the patrolmen will be watching for. According to Major Leo Gossett, commander of the 49-county Midland Region of the Department of Public Safety, there will be many rest stops for travelers to stop and take brief rests from driving. Gossett reminded that this "coffee stations" has played a big part in saving of many Texas citizens lives.
