### Fort Blair Site Is Given Confederate Marker

ily fort" used throughout the Civil War, Old Fort Blair in Desdemona, was awarded a 27 by 42 inch Confederate Memorial information marker in ceremonies Saturday.

The old fort was started by C. C. Blair, an 1857 settler, and from 1861 to 1865 occupants of the fort were William Arthur, Blair, J. M. Ellison, Jasper, Jim and Tom Gilbert, W. C. McGough, W. H. Mansker and others.

Obtaining ammunition and supplies only by making long dangerous trips to the Brazos settlements or to the south, the fort had 12 log cabins. each 14 feet square and 14 feet

By the use of fat renderings, beeswax , wood ashes,

wild herbs, bark, roots, berries, and animal skins, occuants made candles, soap, soda, food and clothing. Families had to promote education for their children.

Other area forts included Allen's Ranch in Eastland County; Lynch and Green Ranches in Shackelford County; Buffalo Springs in Clay County; Bragg's and Murray Forts, Young County; Picketville, Fort Davis, Owls Head and Mugginsville, Stephens County.

### VETS QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q - I have heard that the so-called paraplegic housing is also available to blinded veterans. Is this correct?


A - Assistance, up to \$10,-000, in acquiring specially adapted housing is provided for veterans with service-connected total disabilities including the loss or permanent loss of use of both legs requiring use of wheel chair crutches, cane or braces. For veterans with service - connected blindness, the loss of use of one leg is

sufficient to qualify. Q — My husband was a veteran of World War I. Will the VA furnish a monument for his grave?

A - The Department of the Army will furnish a headstone or marker for the grave. Any VA office will assist in making application.

Q - Does National Service Life Insurance or U. S. Government Life Insurance ever count as income on claims filed with the VA?

A - Usually not. However, NSLI or USGLI does count as income for parents filing claims for Dependency and Indemnity compensation.



## Browsing With Bev

Many people think the wattage on an incadescent light bulb indicates the amount of light the bulb will produce. This is not so. Consumer specitlists in the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Electrification Administration say wattage indicates only the amount of electrical energy the bulb uses.

Although a 100-watt bulb gives more light than a 50-watt, it may not necessarily give twice as much. In fact, a 100-watt usually throws out much more than twice the amount of light of a 50-watt bulb

So, if you want to get the most light, use one built of large wattage rather than two smaller ones that add up to that wattage — providing, of course, distribution of light is not a problem.

The name sour cream is almost a misnomer, for the commercially prepared sour cream available on today's market is not "soured," but is "cultured."
Lactic acid is the magic ingredient for making sour cream. It is added to pasturized and homogenized light sweet cream, and results in specially controlled, really tasty sour cheam.

An excellant way to use sour cream is an accent to

sour cream may be made a bit smoother and stiffer by whipping slightly. Don't over whip or you may make butter. You may want to stir sour cream into sauces and gravies at the end of cooking, adding only a tablespoon at a time. Heat sour cream gently, but do not boil. Cook sour cream hollandaise-type mixtures over warm, not boiling water, rather than direct heat. These with cooked vegetables such as broccoli and asparagus, and for garnishing fruit or vegetable





### **Hoppers High-Flying Big Appetites**

Grasshoppers get away up in the air when it comes to the subject of food.

Various species are strong fliers, and adults sometimes gather in giant swarms moving hundreds of miles and destroying crops and range plants wherever they pause. Individual hoppers have been snared in airplane traps at altitudes around 1,000 feet, but entomological history reveals that hordes in migration have reached heights nearing the ene-mile mark.

The most spectacular example of the high fliers in this country occurred in 1874 when migrating swarms of Rocky Mountain Grasshoppers swept the Great Plains causing such a bod shortage that it was dubbed as a national disaster.

In the last few days in Eastland County many farmers and crop growers have been complaining about the insect grasshopper. According to Assistant County Agent, Bill McCutchen, the hoppers are most destructive in the tight soil lands.

A bait mixture has been sent out to all farmers who have been complaining about the hoppers in Eastland County. A formula is used with ingredients of Aldrin, Heptachler, Chlordane, and Texa-

The grasshopper season has hit Eastland County, but with certain baits and poisons the hoppers can and will be controlled to a minimum, he said.

An observer in Nebraska reported that one of the invading waves of hoppers averaged half a mile wide and 300 miles long. In some places the columns were one mile high and an estimated guess of 28 million per cubic mile.

Many species travel long distances on the wing. Locusts, or grasshoppers have become an international prob-



lem in certain parts of the world. They breed in one country and migrate hundreds of miles to another to devastate crops.

Coming back down to earth, we find that government surveys keep a sharp eye on hatching, development and flying hoppers to help grow-ers plan their control programs. Researchers recommend spraying infested areas with a pesticide when the in-sects are "plentiful and sta-ble, hatching is complete and egg deposition hasn't start-

Growers report excellent, long-lasting control of hoppers with a newer carbamate insecticide, that is safer to use than many other insecticides. They find that drift problems are minimized using this material, and treated crops can be fed to their livestock without harmful residues showing up in meat or milk.

Reports indicate that a ton of alfalfa per day in each 40-acre field can be eaten by hoppers when the population reaches 15 to 20 per square yard. That is w h y entomologists tell growers to be alert early to infestations and apply controls to hatching ar-eas, roadsides, fence rows and headlands before these high flying pests move to adjacent crops.
