ASCS Committeemen Election Set Sept. 8

Jesse G. Meredith, Eastland County ASCS manager, has announced that a mail election for the purpose of electing 1966 community committeemen will be held on Sept. 8, with the incumbent community committee to prepare a slate which will be mailed to all known eligible voters on Aug. 27.

Nominations may be made by petition when signed by at least six eligible voters. Persons who fail to receive ballots by mail may obtain them at the ASCS office. The County Convention will be held on Sept. 22 for the purpose of electing the County Committeemen.

Mr. Meredith also announced that notices concerning 1966 crop measurements will be mailed by Aug. 13. Notices of acreage should be studied carefully and inquiries directed to the county office.

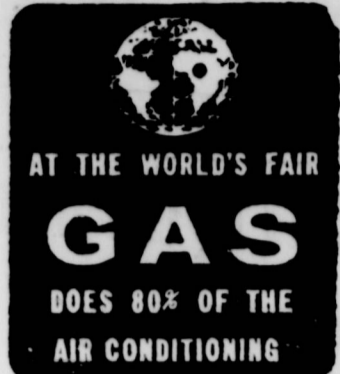
County Board Prepares For New School Term

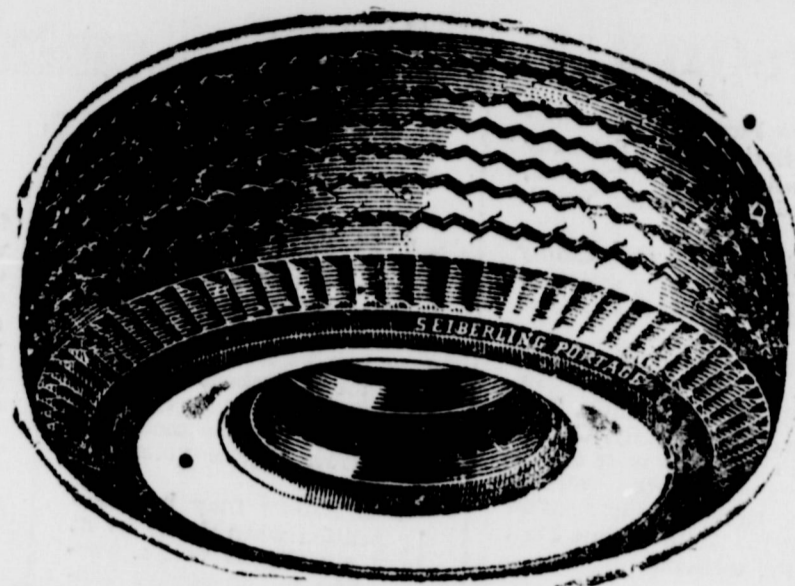

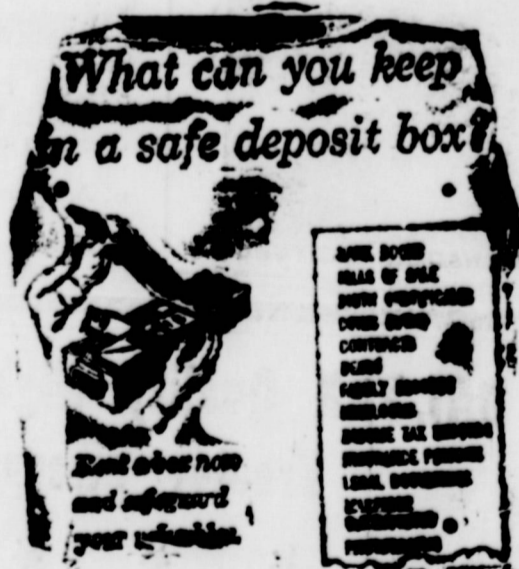

Browsing With Bev

Sweaters are important parts of fall and winter wardrobes. They can be high fashion items as well as practical.

Selection of a sweater usually depends on several considerations: Individual preference, activity of the person, clothing budget, and the method of care the garment will require.

Sweaters are cut and sewn as in regular fabrics, or are shaped by full fashioning where the designs are knitted to a particular shape. The full fashion sweaters are more expensive.

Many of today's sweaters of decorative trim in relation to the service the sweater will get and the maintenance cost. The trim should require the same care as the rest of the sweater.

The finish around the sweater neck is important. Necks can be finished by single or double thickness of ribbing. For soft yarns, as cashmere or nylon, a double thickness keeps the shape more adequately.

Buttonholes should be of fine stitches with well-tacked ends.

Always read labels carefully for care instructions. Jot down a description of the sweater on the label and file it for future reference. If

sweaters are inadequately labeled, do not purchase.

Careful laundering of sweaters is essential. Wool sweaters should be washed in cool water with a mild, neutral soap, then blotted and dried flat. Some of the wool fibers are treated chemically for stability and are machine washable. Many of the synthetics may be machine washed and dried at low temperatures.

Nonfat dry milk and skim milk are among the many dairy foods in abundance now as the nation observes June Dairy Month.

These forms of milk actually are whole milk with most of the fat removed.

Skim milk is sold in containers, house-to-house or at nearly all dairy counters, just as other fluid milks. It needs to be refrigerated to stay at its fresh best. Skim milk may be used just as whole milk, as a beverage or in cooking. You may choose this form of milk to reduce calories or cost of the finished dish.
