## **COLORADO** SCHOOLS MUST WESTBROOK PICTURE IS IMPROVE, REPORT SAYS

In order that the Colorado schools may be properly certified by the Department of Education, there are several requirements to be met before the opening of the next school, the most essential of which is to eliminate the crowded condition existing in some of the class rooms.

The report was made following an inspection of the schools here by W. B. Mikesell, a member of the State committee. In speaking of the crowd. ed conditions found in some of the class rooms, the report outlines:

"That adequate measures be taken to prevent overcrowding in the elementary rooms before the opening of school next year, so that each room may be in full session with no more than forty pupils.

"At present there are as many as seventy-two enrolled in one room with fifty-six in regular attendance. In the two lower grades and in part of the third there are only half day sessions. The rooms are all crowded with seats. There have been good rains and an incipient oil boom of late, which give indication of greater evercrowding next year unless additional space is provided. Good high school work cannot be maintained if the elementary pupils are thus crowded.

"The science department is very good," the report says, "for all of the sciences taught in the way of demonstration apparatus. The individual apparatus does not meet requirement in number of sets, nor in space in which to use duplicate sets. This shortcoming is remedied by small sections working in repeated laboratory periods."







# IN WEST AND SOUTHWEST

WASHINGTON, April 18 .- Business conditions in the West and Southwest have improved 100 per cent over last fall, Eugene Meyer, Jr., managing director of the war finance corporation, declared today upon his return from a survey of twenty states west of the Mississippi made at the request of President Harding.

"Easier money in the east is bringing in money on land mortgages into the west for the first time in a long time," said Mr. Meyer,

"Mines are reopening which should help conditions in Utah, Montana and Arizona.

Agriculturally the outlook for planting is a little late but this is more than compensated for by the fact of prevailing moisture. There is a feeling that agricultural prospects have never been so good in years because of the moisture and in sections where there has been a scarcity of rain for the last two years the outlook is good and farmers are
