#### COLORADO CITIZENS FAVOR ADOPTION OF PAVING LAWS

There is but small opposition to be found against the proposed adoption of the general paving laws, it is claimed by the Chamber of Commerce. In discussing the matter Thursday, an official of the chamber stated that he was finding less people opposing the proposed measure than any constructive program inaugurated at Colorado for several

"The citizenship of this city appreciate the value of the investment to be made in paving and will roll up an overwhelming vote in favor of the measure authorizing the city government to negotiate paving contracts to cover the principal business district," he said. "Those enthused over the proposed paving are not confined to the small property owner, but with few exception, all of the larger property owners, who will be directly affected, are agitating supoct of the proposed paving."

The election to determine whether provisions of the general paving laws shall be adopted will be held April 3. The provisions of this law would authorize the city to contract for paving, making assessments against abutting property owners for about two thirds of the cost. A preliminary survey of Second street is being made by the city this week.





For some time the various companies have been interested in the trend of the Marathon fold and bulletin No. 1850 of the bureau of economic geology at Austin, published in 1918, giving much good information on Mitchell county, has been read widely and followed by the geologists. This caused work to be started the results of which are well known, and now Mitchell county is included in the producing area of this vast state.

As the Scurry locality received but very little attention by the U. S. or Texas geological surveys, the various companies and geologists paid but little attention to the area, but after Mitchell county started to look so favorable, this county being in the natural trend came in for an examination, and now they look upon it as even more possible than the adjoining county to the south. As stated above, very little work in the geological line was done by the government geologists and it was up to some other concern to do the pioneer work in the region. For that reason the report of Foster and Reiter, the well known geological firm, on this area is of special interest, as it never before has been made public and is worthy of perusal. It will be remembered that it was this firm that mapped the Mexia and Currie structures for the Humphreys interests, and this report on Scurry county for that reason is of importance.

The area mapped by the firm of Foster and Reiter is known as the Ira anticline, located in the south central part of Scurry county. Snyder, the county seat, is on the Santa Fe railroad, 205 miles from Amarillo thirty-eight miles from Sweetwater and 245 miles from Fort Worth. The town of Ira has a population of 100 and is located on the north flank of the anticline. The wagon roads ar very good for unimproved roads.

The topograppy in the vicinity of the Ira anticline is gently rolling with the exception of a few steep bluffs along the Colorado river. The elevation varies from 2,150 feet to .350 feet. The Colorado river and ts tributaries form the drainage ystem. The manner in which the Colorado is deflected and flows around the Ira anticline is a pertinent indication of structure. Water vells furnishing the stock water are from forty to 140 feet deep through-

Outcroppings at Ira are of the Quartermaster period of the highest Permian. These beds have been traced down the Colorado river into Coke county, where they were named the Beede and Bently in their report on Coke county. A regional map which accompanied the report shows the approximate position of the Quartermaster beds to be running practically through the center of Mitchell county and the south central portion of Scurry. To the west are the beds known to be of the Triassic age, to the south in Coke county and one small area on the south side of the Ira anticline are found beds of the Double mountain (Texas) or Greer (Oklahoma) of Permian age.


