



Presbyterian Movement. Several cities have named dates in the statewide movement for Christian education now being conducted by the Presbyterians of Texas for \$1,350,000 for their schools and colleges. Word has been received at headquarters in Dallas that the Presbyterians of Houston have decided to launch their campaign on November 8. On November 16 there will be a dinner to the church officers at which time the plan of campaign will be explained. On Sunday, December 2, the churches will be occupied by visiting ministers and special sermons will be preached on Christian education. The intensive canvass among the members will open on December 4 and the campaign will close on December 13. This is the first of the large city campaigns in the Texas movement.

Bryan Presbyterians will open their campaign on November 24, and the dinner to church officers will be held on November 27. Tyler will open on November 3 and the opening dinner to officers will be held on November 9. Campaigns are now being conducted in Navasota and \$4,742.37 Paris and will close in both places next week.

There will be a city campaign in about 45 of the cities and towns of Texas in addition to the work in the smaller churches conducted by the field division.






