Is Coastal Bermuda Grass Operations Profitable? - 'Yes', County Test Shows

Considerable interest has been shown in coastal bermuda grass pasture as a forage source on Eastland Coun-

ty livestock farms. Several thousand acres have been converted from cropland to coastal bermuda grass pasture by Eastland County producers.

What everyone is interested in, is the annual expense of this grass and expected returns. In other words, what is the value of an acre of coastal bermuda? Last month a group of Eastland County farmers and ranchers, with experience in operating units having acreage of coastal bermuda, got together with Soil Conservation Service personnel to analyze the cost and expected returns from bermuda grass pasture.

From their experiences, the group determined the cost of establishment, as \$32.85 per acre. This figure includes the cost of fertilizer and control of competition along with another establishment operation.

Annual costs were determined to be \$29 per acre. This would be fertilizing with 100 pounds of nitrogen, 30 lbs. of phosphate, and 30 lbs. of potash.

As this fertility level, the group felt a reasonable level of management would be a cow per acre for six months, planning to run the cows on native range the balance of the year.

The group based their findings on 800 acres of range land and 80 acres of coastal bermuda grass pasture. They used 80 animal units as the cow herd on this place. Livestock costs per year on this unit were \$3,988 and forage costs, pastureland and range land, were \$3,076. A total annual expense of \$7,064 or an annual cost of \$88.30 per animal unit.

Using 1964 beef prices, the group determined a gross re-

FIRST PATRONAGE CAPITAL REFUNDED BY COUNTY REA

The Comanche County Electric Cooperative has mailed "Patronage Capital" refund checks to some 2,000 members and former members for the return of capital contributed during the years 1939 through 1943.

The membership equity including operating capital and reserves is furnished by the members as a part of the electric service bill which they pay each month.

At the end of each year, all funds which are in excess of actual operating expenses are credited to the members' capital accounts. In keeping with the ideals of a cooperative, non-profit operation, it is the aim of the management and the board of directors to return this capital as soon as it is financially possible to do so.

This year it was felt that the Cooperative could begin to refund the oldest capital

and have prepared checks to 2,000 members totaling \$28,000. Most of these were mailed last week and the others are being mailed as correct addresses can be found.

Browsing With Bev

In selecting garments or fabrics of stretch, the direction of the stretch is important. Today's fabrics have warp, lengthwise or vertical; filling, crosswise or horizontal; and two-way stretch, a combination of warp and filling.

For longer wear, an extra margin of stretch is recommended. Research results on show tailored clothing, horizontal stretch, 25 to 35 per cent; pants with stirrups, vertical, 40 to 60 per cent stretch; sportswear, horizontal, 25 to 40 per cent.

Sizing of stretch garments should follow regular sizing methods. Stretch garments have the advantage of a tailored smooth fit, yet provide for movement when it is needed. They are not intended to be worn skin-tight.

In caring for stretch garments, give them a chance to relax and snap back into shape often. Let the garments rest between wearings. Launder and press in relation to the most heat-sensitive fiber. Read labels for fiber contents and care procedure.

Mildew spots should be removed as soon as they are discovered. Don't give the mold a chance to weaken or

Sonic Booms Due In This Region Next 3 Months

Supersonic training flights by Strategic Air Command B-58 Hustler bombers will be flown Jan. 1 - Mar. 31, 1965 along a route from a point 20 miles southeast of Paducah, Tex., over Austin and ending near Shiner, Tex. The route crosses south Eastland County.

Flights along the route may occur daily, but normally will not be scheduled between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.

Scoring equipment at the Air Force radar bomb scoring site at Bergstrom Air Force Base near Austin will determine the accuracy of simulated bomb drops through the use of radio and radar signals. No bombs are carried on these training missions.

The bombers will fly at supersonic speeds up to Mach 2 (1,300 m.p.h.) at altitudes above 35,000 feet.

Training corridors for the SAC bombers are rotated periodically because realistic training benefits diminish when the crews become familiar with the land marks, simulated target complexes and other identifying characteristics of a particular area.

One of the features of the B-58, the free world's fastest bomber, is its ability to sustain supersonic speed over substantial distances while approaching and leaving its target. This capability enhances crew survival and assures a high probability of mission success despite strong enemy defensive measures normally expected over a target.

(Continued from Page One.) turn of \$7753.20 from the unit or a net profit of \$689.

In comparing this type of operation with information developed in 1963 on an all rangeland enterprise at the same level of management. It was found that the unit with coastal bermuda grass made the coastal bermuda grass worth \$25 per acre in 1964.

In looking again at the annual expense on the operation with bermuda grass, the \$88.-30 per animal unit expense produced 549 pounds of beef per animal unit.

Cost of production would be \$16. per 100 pounds of beef produced. The straight range operation ran \$62.75 annual per animal unit expense producing 371 pounds per animal unit. Cost of production \$17 per 100 pounds of beef pro-

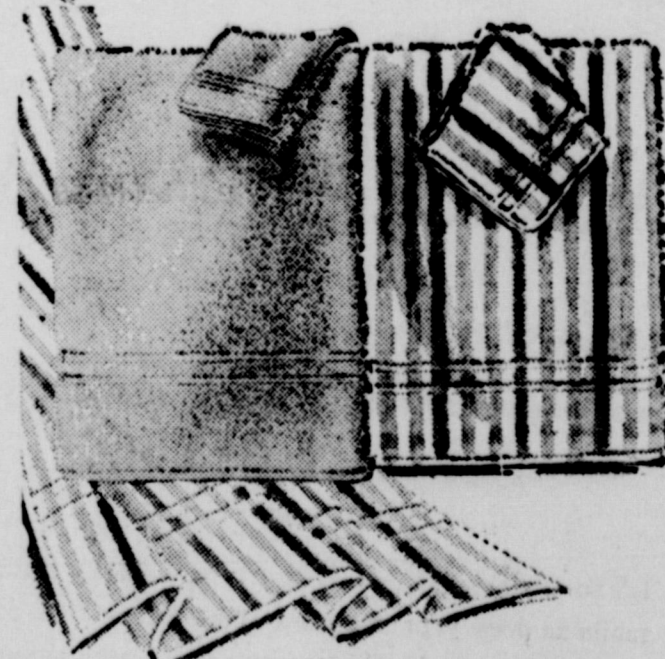
