### Mrs. Campbell's Mother Dies At Eastland

Frances Adeline Vaughn, mother of Mrs. Collin Campbell, died about 11 a.m. Saturday in Eastland Memorial Hospital after an illness of about eight years. She had been in a nursing home since May, 1964.

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Monday in Arrington Hamner Funeral Home Chapel, Eastland, with Rev. Ben G. Stewart, pastor of the Eastland Church of God, officiating. The 12th annual Eastland County Pecan Show will be held December 11-12 in the Joseph building in Ranger, according to W. T. Eaton, president of the Chamber of Commerce, and C. M. Smith, of Rising Star, president of the growers association, co-sponsors of the two-day affair.

Classes have been set up for 34 different papershell varieties of pecans, including the popular Choctaw, Wichita, and Comanche, which have been developed in recent years.

The event has been held for the past several years in Ranger. Members of the Association annually vote on the site for the show, and Ranger has consistently had the largest number of members.

Originated by Eastland County Agent J. M. Cooper in 1952 as a stimulus to the development of the pecan industry in the county and area, the show was held in Cisco for several years.

Entries of pecans are accepted from growers in East-

land and adjoining counties. The annual Eastland County Pecan "Queen" contest will be held at the Ranger Junior College in connection with the show.

Details of the 1964 event were recently worked out by the officers and directors of the growers, Mrs. Beverly R. Nicholson, county home demonstration agent, and the agricultural committee of the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, according to Dr. John Foster, chairman.

A quart fruit jar full of nuts constitute an entry. They must be entered by noon on Dec. 11. However they may be left at the county agent's office at the courthouse prior to this time, it was explained.

One trophy and several plaques will be awarded to the top winners of the show through the courtesy of the National Shellers and Processors Association of Chicago, jointly presented in co-sponsorship with several state organizations.

**Questions  
Answers**

My husband and I are pensioners for two children deceased. Will we continue if we have children?

Yes. When I am discharged from the service, will I be entitled to any pension from VA?

A — Pension benefits are available to veterans who are permanently and totally disabled from causes not attributable to their military service provided they have had 90 or more days active service, any part of which was served in wartime, or if they were discharged for disability. The veteran must also meet certain income limits. Get in touch with the nearest VA regional office to get further details.

Q — Are veterans ever required to pay for care received in Veterans Administration hospitals?

A — The circumstances under which a veteran might be charged for care received in a VA hospital arise rarely.

It is possible that a veteran admitted to a VA hospital, is later determined not to have a legal entitlement. In such a case the veteran would be billed for his care. Also a veteran may be admitted for injuries sustained in an automobile or industrial accident and "third party" liability determined later. If the veteran is awarded damages based wholly or in part on the cost of the medical services involved, the VA may seek payment.

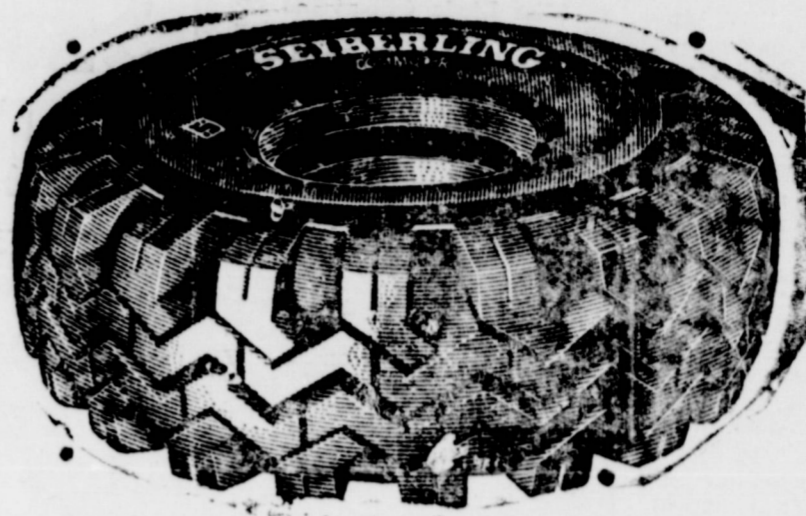

## Browsing With Bev

Preparing sandwiches for the school lunch pail can be a real morning chore for mothers who have several children in school. It can be made easier by preparing a large quantity of sandwiches at one time, then freezing them. Wrapped in a double thickness of heavy waxed paper, sandwiches can be stored a week in the freezer without loss of quality. If you use a moisture vapor-resistant wrap, you can extend this period to two or three weeks.

But don't put in any raw vegetables such as lettuce, celery, or tomatoes. They lose crispness, color, and flavor when frozen. Also, the whites of hard-cooked eggs become tough, and jellies or

very moist fillings such as egg salad or tuna salad soak in the bread.

Wrap the sandwiches separately. Freeze at 0 degrees F. or below.

Frozen sandwiches can be placed directly into the lunch pail. By noon, they'll be complete.

There's a new kind of cotton rickrack on the market. It's no-iron variety, which means that the edges won't curl after each washing.

When painting your home, always follow the sun. Paint the north side early in the morning, the east side late in the morning, the south wall after noon, and the west side during the late afternoon.

Place cotton denim or canvas sneakers on shoe trees to dry after washing them. This enables the fabric to dry more smoothly and eliminates puckers around the toes.

## Records Say Patrolmen Deserve Commendation

The Department of Public Safety — better known as Highway Patrolmen — were commended by the last 91st District Court grand jury, and a check of the county court docket gives a good indication of why they were cited.

Of the 34 cases tried in county court through late November, 27 were DPS cases, showing that the Highway Patrolmen are waging an active war on traffic violators of several kilts and killers.

Here's a breakdown of the cases filed in the county court this year:

For instance, there were 20 driving while intoxicated cases; five driving with licenses suspended cases; one negligent homicide case; and one aggravated assault case filed by Highway Patrolmen.

D. W. I., 44 cases; DWLS, eight cases; liquor violations, five; child desertions, two; contributing to the delinquency of a minor, three; defrauded by check, four; negligent homicide, two; swindling with

worthless check, two; aggravated assault, one; failure to surrender licenses, (plates, registration receipt, drivers license) one; and failure to comply with school compulsory law, one.

The grand jury report said this of the Highway Patrolmen: "We particularly wish to commend the members of the Department of Public Safety for their untiring efforts in the protection of the lives and property of citizens who use our highways."

One of the grand jurymen called the DPS officers in Eastland County among the most efficient in the state.

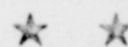
