Mr. Vaughn, County Pioneer, Dies At Gorman

Mr. Leaster Vaughn, 74, retired farmer and one of Eastland County's oldest pioneers, died about 4:30 a. m. Tuesday in the Gorman Hospital after a weeks illness following a stroke.

Funeral services were conducted from the First Baptist Church Wednesday at 2:30 p. m. with the Pastor, Rev. Floyd B. Littlepage, officiating assisted by Rev. Lee Fields. Burial was in Murray Memorial Cemetery with Higginbotham Funeral Home of Gorman in charge of arrangements.

Born October 1, 1890 in Winfield, Ala., Mr. Vaughn came to Mineola, Texas with his parents at the age of 4 and at the age of 14 he moved to Eastland County.

In 1919 he was married to Miss Callie Martin who survives. The family had resided on their farm south of Carbon for many years. He was converted at the age of 31 and attended services at the Baptist Church regularly when his health permitted.

Survivors besides his wife include 3 sons, Wayne of Odessa, Elvis of Midland and Garland of Pasadena; three daughters, Mrs. Lou Ella Murray of Pleasanton, Mrs. Wilmath Brown of Clyde and Mrs. Doris Lewis of Abilene; 12 grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Business Is Booming In Highways

The Texas Highway Department's Eastland operations are an important economic factor with almost \$20,000 in annual payrolls.

And the amount of money spent for highway construction within the bounds of the county is staggering.

From 1947 to the present time some \$12,000,000 have been spent on construction, Resident Engineer R. P. (Buddy) Haun reports. And from now until 1972, when the Interstate 20 project is to be completed, another \$16,000,000 will have been spent.

And there'll be a lot of other highway construction and rebuilding in the next ten years too, he said, because all the secondary roads are to be redone in the near future.

On the planning boards are projects including the modernization of Highway 6 from Eastland northward to the "Y"; the complete renovation of 183 from Rising Star to the "Y" north of Cisco and Eastland; and the improvement of 14 miles of State 16.

The public probably doesn't realize that the Texas Highway Department has 44 employees working at or out of the Eastland headquarters — 24 are in Mr. Haun's Engineering Department, and 20 in Mr. H. L. (Mutt) Lewis' maintenance department.

Surprisingly too, a check revealed that of the five registered, professional engineers in Eastland, three are Texas Highway Department employees — Mr. Haun, Tommy Magness and Richard Johnson. (The other two are Mac Beazley with Texas Electric Service Co. and Ray Pool of Lone Star Gas Co.)

Number of general admis-

sion seats has been increased this year, with an equal cut-back in reserved seats to be available, Eastland Jaycee President Dick Johnson has announced.

Tickets may be purchased in Cisco at Dean Drug Store; in Ranger, at Crawford-Doss Drug; and in Eastland at the Mens Shop. Prices are \$1.50 for general admission and \$2. for reserved seats.

In prior years, all general admission seating has been on the east side, but because of the record "standing room only" crowds that attend the annual event in Maverick Stadium in Eastland, it was decided to increase the number of general admissions, Grover Hallmark, ticket-chairman, has announced.

Lake Leon Is Stocked With 33,000 Catfish

Over 33,000 channel catfish were put in Lake Leon this week by the State Game and Fish Commission, according to C. B. Pruet, president of the Eastland County Water Supply District.

This is the first installment of an order sent to the commission in July by the board in an effort to keep Lake Leon well stocked.

The original order included channel catfish, yellow catfish, crappie, bass and wall-eyed pike.

A letter from the commission stated that they had been doing some experimental planting of walleyes, secured from the state of Iowa, in an effort to get them started in Texas. They have been planted in Possum Kingdom Lake and the newly created Canyon Reservoir.

The letter from the commission stated that if these experiments were successful some walleyes would possibly be planted in Lake Leon, Mr. Pruet said.

Peanut Tour On Today

Three irrigated and three dryland crops will be inspected during the all day Eastland County Peanut Tour on Thursday, October 15, it was announced today from the county agent's office. The tour is being sponsored by the crops division of the County Program Building Committee.

All of the farms to be visited on the tour will be in the southeastern part of the county in the Gorman area.

Irrigated Spanish type peanuts will be seen on the Bill Andry, Claude Fuller and the Wayne Eaves farms. On the latter farm a patch of the Virginia Runner peanuts, a variety popular in the old South especially in Alabama and Georgia will be observed.

A field of the Starr variety of peanut, named in honor of W. B. Starr, one of the first growers of peanuts in the county who lives in the Scranton Community, will be inspected on the Mitchel Camp-

seed certification.

Other dryland peanut crops will be observed on the D. B. Warren farm and the Vernon Files place. A demonstration on nematode control on peanut will be seen on the Warren farm. This is being conducted through cooperation of officials of the Dow Chemical Co., manufacturers of the soil fumigant, Tellone, the County Agent said.

The group will leave from the Brown Jug Cafe in Gorman at 9 a.m. Oct. 15th date and will return there for lunch at noon. During the noon break Ross Wilson, manager of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association, will discuss the Aflatoxin problem.

B. C. Langley, Stephenville, superintendent of the Agricultural Research Station there and developer of the Starr variety of peanuts has accepted an invitation to attend.

Deer Hunting Is Set To Open Day Early This Year

AUSTIN — Ranchers in the battle-blitzed big game country have embraced the bonus early opening provision for the fall deer season in regulatory responsibility areas, reports J. Weldon Watson, executive director of the Parks and Wildlife Department.

The proposal to open the season on Saturday, November 14 as provided by state law, got a resounding

sanction at the public hearings in early summer.

The Parks and Wildlife Commission, which originally proposed the early opener, promptly acknowledged the support at its next meeting and set the wheels in motion to effect the historic change.

The extra weekend arrangement will be followed in most of the counties where the wildlife resources are managed directly by the Commission.

The 102 counties still under General Law will not be affected by the early opener since the November 16 date

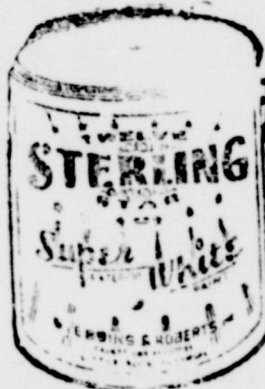

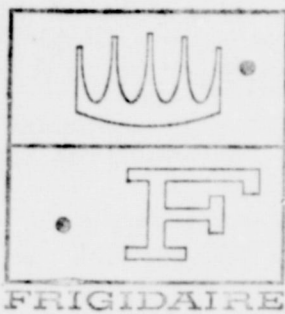
