Rising Star Man Killed In Wreck

Jack Leon Edmiston, 55, of Route 2, Rising Star, was killed about 4:45 p. m. Friday when his pickup truck overturned 2.1 miles from Gorman on State Highway 6.

Highway Patrolman Jack Therwanger of Eastland said Edmiston's pickup ran off the road on the right side and traveled approximately 1,000 feet in the borrow ditch before turning over.

Edmiston was dead when the wreck was discovered. A wrecker was used to remove his body from the pickup.

Therwanger was assisted in the investigation by Highway Patrol Sgt. Roger Sosebee and Patrolman E. M. Rogers.

Mr. Edmiston lived on the Rising Star farm of O. R. Buchanan of Gorman.

Labels on food must state the ingredients of a product in the order that they are present. In other words, if there is more potato than meat in a brand of hash, the label will have potato before meat in the statement of content. Labels must carry a statement of contents except in cases where the government has set a "standard of identity". Since the list of ingredients given on the label is in descending order as they appear in the product, consumers can profit by reading the labels. If chicken is way down the

list on a can of chicken soup, you can be sure there is not much chicken in the soup. Check another brand and you may find chicken first or second on the label, indicating a higher chicken content. This labeling provides the consumer with a "window" into the package.

Pour out the water, and you have a half-cup fat. Some water may cling to the fat, so it is best to use this method for such foods as pastery, which calls for moisture.

Cecil Elliott Seriously Hurt

A Cisco man was seriously injured and three automobiles were damaged in a three vehicle collision at 8:25 a.m. Monday at Highway 80 and Avenue D. A 1961 Chevy truck driven by Billy Fred Weeks of Elba, Ala. was in collision with a 1958 Ford driven by Cecil Elliott, 1007 Avenue D.

Police investigative reports showed that the brakes on Mr. Weeks' truck did not hold when he came down the viaduct, and he plowed into the back of a 1958 Ford driven by Mr. Elliott causing the collision with the 1962 Ford driven by Leroy Cook of Boyd, Texas.

Approximately \$150 damage resulted on the Chevy truck and the Cook car, and the Elliott auto was a total loss.

Mr. Elliott is in Graham Hospital with serious head and back injuries, although his condition was not listed as critical.
