### Scott Bailey To Ask Re-election As County Judge

County Judge Scott Bailey has announced his candidacy for re-election. In making his announcement, Judge Bailey said that he wished to express his appreciation to the people of Eastland County for allowing him the opportunity to serve in this important office.

Bailey, who is at this time unopposed for re-election is a lifetime resident of Eastland County, having been born and reared in Cisco. He is a veteran of the Korean Conflict, married, and he and Mrs. Bailey have a son and daughter.

He said that he would have a formal statement of his candidacy at a later date and he would make every effort to see and talk to as many voters as possible between now and the May 2nd Democratic Primary Election in which he is a candidate.

## Five County Plan Okayed By USDA

Secretary of Agriculture Clifford M. Hardin has authorized agencies of the U. S. Department of Agriculture to provide assistance to sponsors of the Texas Leon-Bosque Resource Conservation and Development project in developing a project plan, Congress-

man Omar Burleson announced late this week.

The Leon-Bosque RC&D Project comprises 2,963,120 acres in Erath, Eastland, Bosque and Somerville and Comanche Counties. The Soil Conservation Service will have Department of Agriculture leadership in USDA assistance to the project which will begin at once. E. E. McAllister, Eastland County Soil Conservation supervisor, reports.

The Upper Leon, Bosque and Palo Pinto Soil and Water Conservation Districts, joined by the Commissioner Courts of the five counties concerned, have teamed up to sponsor the Leon-Bosque Resource Conservation and Development Area. They propose to develop and carry out a plan for the orderly development, conservation, improvement and wise use of the natural resources of the five counties.

The plan will call for total community development by participation of all segments of the population. It will be a plan to uplift the economy of the area and to serve the needs of all the people, McAllister said.

Marion Porter, Stephenville, is assigned to work with RC&D directors to start development of the area plan. He will

coordinate activities and work closely with local personnel, to assist local organizations in planning and carrying out their projects.

Eastland County RC&D directors include:

Sam Powers, Palo Pinto SWCD, Desdemona; Joe B. Criswell, Upper Leon, Rising Star; E. F. Harrison, county building committee, Gorman; B. W. McKinnis, Texas Electric Service Co., Eastland; W. B. Wright, Cisco attorney; Glyn Gilliam, Ranger banker; A. D. Jenkins, Rising Star, insurance and real estate; E. G. Henderson, Gorman, businessman; James Rutherford, Rising Star banker; Mike Collins, Eastland County Historical Society; Mack Stubblefield, Carbon, businessman; and Dick Foster, Gorman, county commissioner.

Steering committee members to serve on the Leon-Bosque RC&D are Sam Powers of Desdemona and Judge Scott Bailey, alternate.

Leon-Bosque objectives are:

1. Develop the natural resources of the area, including woodland, wildlife, cropland, grassland and livestock.

2. Develop water resources of the area for transportation, municipal, industrial, agricultural and recreational purposes.

3. Orderly development of the vast recreation and tourism potential of the area.

4. Encourage industrial expansion and other developments to improve job opportunities and family income.

5. Develop adequate sewage and water supply systems for towns and communities and establish rural garbage collection and disposal systems.

6. Accelerate work on the watershed treatment programs and extend the program to cover all watersheds in the area.

7. Improve and secure adequate community facilities for health, education and recreation.

8. Expand vocational training and Junior College facilities to meet needs for training and retraining manpower.

9. Accelerate soil surveys in project proposal areas.

10. Beautify and improve the general appearance of the area.

11. Develop access roads needed to scenic and recreational areas.

12. Encourage use of credit and technical assistance to improve size of farms, land use adjustment, housing and increase farm income.

13. Secure necessary legislation to deal with problems of water management, pollution, rural zoning and taxation for county improvement.

14. Develop better marketing facilities for agricultural products.



CONG. BURLESON Files for Re-Election Burleson Will Seek Return To Congress Seat

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Congressman Omar Burleson, who represents the 17th District of Texas in the U. S. House of Representatives, has announced for re-election.

He has filed for a place on the ballot in the Democratic Primary Election on May 2, 1970.

Burleson was elected to the 80th Congress from the 17th District and has been re-elected to each succeeding Congress. He is a member of the Ways and Means Committee, considered to be the most powerful and prestigious in the House.

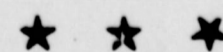

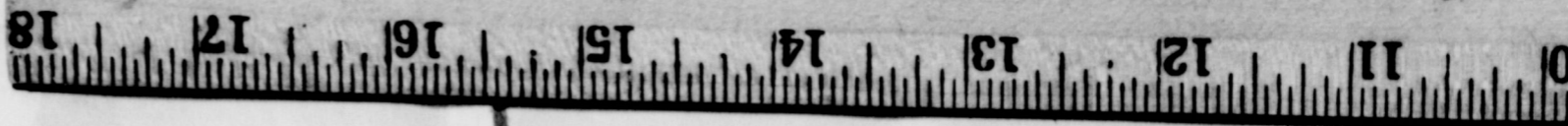

Texas. It runs from Cisco south through Rising Star to Brownwood.

Included in the highway planning for the county is a redesignation of Highway 6 from Eastland through Cisco to Moran and Albany. The route formerly ran from Eastland to Breckenridge, and the to a junction with present US Highway 133 from Cisco to Breckenridge has been redesignated as State 69.

Included in highway construction plans for 1970 is a new bridge on SH 69 immediately north of Eastland. Contract is due to be let in January and the job is expected to be completed in April — barring an unforeseen seige of bad weather, highway officials report.

Construction is underway on three sectors of Interstate Highway 20 — the Cisco, Eastland and Ranger freeways — and when these are completed, only one section, a seven-mile stretch between Eastland and Ranger, will remain for the Brownwood highway district to bring up to standards.

Eastward toward Ft. Worth, it is expected that a year or more will intervene before Interstate specifications are met.

All of the phase 1 work (grading, structures and frontage roads) is under construction or has been completed along that important highway between Fort Worth and the Eastland County line.

All of the phase 2 (paving) work is under contract or has been finished along the same distance with the exception of 8.920 miles from a point 0.8 mile west of FM 4 to 1.4 miles west of Parker County line. That work is in Palo Pinto County and is 80 per cent completion from Eastland north plate, including the frontage roads and their surfacing.

**Highway Work Progressing**

Several important highway developments, some of them under way and others "on the boards" will affect Eastland county and immediate area during 1970.  
Of most importance is Interstate 20 Highway construction under way in various sectors from west of Cisco to east of Ranger, and the reconstruction of U. S. Highway 183 from Cisco southward to Romney, a distance of 10 miles.  
Surveying and planning for reconstruction of an additional 10 miles from Romney to Rising Star at the southern border of Eastland county is now under way and a contract for reconstruction of this portion of the highway is due to be let within the next year, according to officials.  
This is a two-lane divided highway which will be an important addition to the highway system serving the county and area. Highway 183 is an important interstate route north from the Canadian border to the Gulf area of south

**It Has Been**

Editor's Note: The following item is taken from **The Rising Star**, a column written by Vada Arnold and titled "It Has Been."  
One of the most interesting and amusing events in Rising Star Sports history was a Soft ball game played in 1937 at the "Wildcat Park" between the Fats and Leans.  
All players were dressed in feminine attire. Many of the players wore Mother Hubbard dress while others wore dresses of their own choosing. The late Garland Branton was umpire and wore a pretty pink flowered lawn dress with a wide pink satin sash tied in a huge bow.  
The Leans trimmed the Fats in a four inning game before a record breaking crowd. Players on the teams were: Fats—W. E. Ellis, John Joyce, M. D. Gibson, A. T. Shults, Hubert Jones, Mark Clark, A. P. Smith, Mun Hosea, John Millwee, F. J. Maynard, C. L. Wilson and M. E. Crossley.  
Leans — Fred Cook, Dade Myers, H. S. Childress, Jay Koonce, Bus Crownover, Fred Siekman, Guy McDonald, John Roach and W. P. Small.  
Fred Cook was outstanding Lean player while John Mill-

wee was the popular Fat player.  
One Saturday night in September 1937, officers Clifton Hord and Blake Forehand arrested three men from out of town for drunkenness and disturbing the peace and placed them in the city calaboose for the night. Next morning the officers came to town to see about their prisoners. They found one man, suffering from a hang over. The other two were no where to be found. On questioning the one man, he told them that the others had prized the door at the top and made their escape, but that he "was not about to get out for he had a good job in another town and did not want to risk being fired by the company he worked for."  
November 1937 was "Red Letter Day" at May, when the West Texas Utilities Co. formally introduced the installation of electric service to the town and community. A new line was built from Rising Star to May and May had electricity.  
From 600 to 800 people gathered at May for the celebration. A ladies vocal quartette made up of Mrs. O. T. Jarvis, Mrs. H. E. White, Mrs. H. M. McDaniel and Miss Staggs was introduced along with Mrs. Vera Shults as pianist. This group delighted their audience with special vocal numbers.  
W. R. (Bill) Chambers gave a very interesting history of May, its founding and development. Several out of town speakers were there. Mrs. White gave a solo. West Texas Utilities representatives gave household demonstration and passed out free gifts.  
Rising Star High School annual May Pete was held on April 28, 1937, at the high school gym. The following program was presented.  
Introductory remarks, Supt. H. B. Self; Reading, Leon R. Smith; Duet, Willie Jack Smith and Perry Tom Valiant; Reading, Frank Payne, Jr.; Reading, Hoarce Lee Smith and Dorothy Jean Small; Dance, Nettie Lou Neal; Violin Solo, Norman Hubbard.  
High School and Ward School Choral Clubs gave several numbers. The procession and crowning of the May Queen and King were led by John Henry Nunnally. Messengers were John Earl Williams and Jimmie Payne; Flower Girls, Marion Dixon Boggs and Gloria Jean Jones, Edith Ray Agnew and Sarah Alice Cox were Ladies in Waiting and escorts were: Mary Fred Read, Merle Roach, Virginia Cray, Bobby Irby; Beverly Thomas Ray Butler; Sybil Proctor, Jr., Dale Wolf, Betty Jane Joyce, James Fred Cook.  
Seniors-Ladies in Waiting and escorts were: Maty Nell Barnes - Edward Watkins; Gwen Ghormely-Roger Smith; Irma Lee Tune-Mearlyn Jones; Edra Roach-Bobby Joyce; Sophomores, Jeannie Gracey-Glen Bishop; Dorothy Marie Burnett-Miller Ray Henry; Freshman; Ora Lee Lewis-Junior Crawford; Floyd Glen Joyce-Guy Zellars.  
May Queen was Ester Maynard and May King was Gene Hopper. Crown Bearers were Wanda Nay, W. A. Rhymes. Train Bearers were Bryan Eita Milner and Billie Jean Tye.
