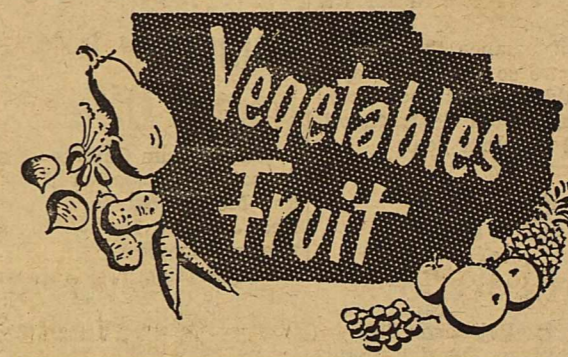

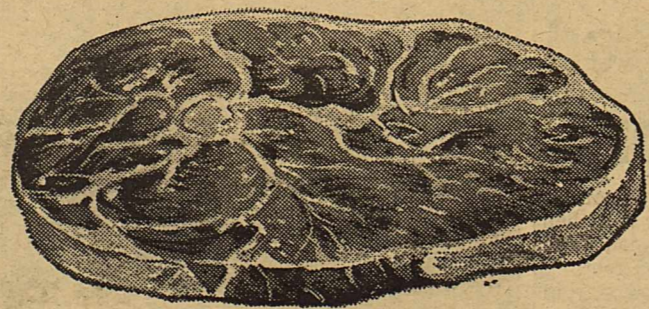

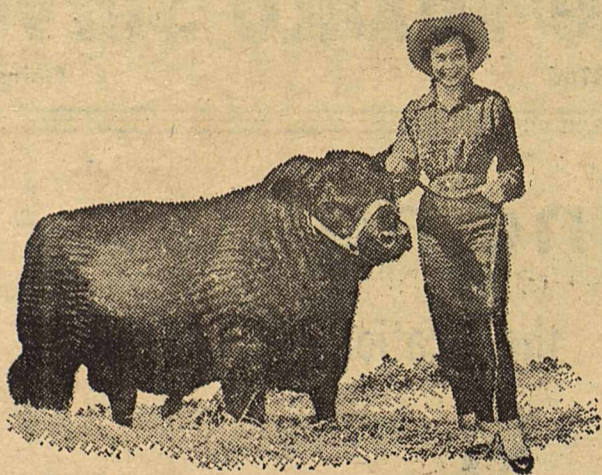

## Only 1,100 Cars In County Inspected

L. W. Wilhite, motor vehicle inspection patrolman for Yoakum County, advised The Press this week that out of the 4,400 vehicles registered in the county, only 1,100 have been inspected to date in compliance with state law.

This represents only 25 percent of the total vehicles in this county required by state law to be inspected, he pointed out. Wilhite said there are six

state approved inspection stations located in Yoakum County, and that motorists should have their vehicles inspected as soon as possible in order to avoid a last minute rush to meet the April 15 deadline.

Captain Alan Johnson, Service Commander of Motor Vehicle Inspection of Region 5 of the Texas Department of Public Safety, reports that only 30 percent of the registered vehicles in the region have been inspected to date for the year 1958.

Captain Johnson pointed out that motorists are subject to a fine of \$100 to \$200.

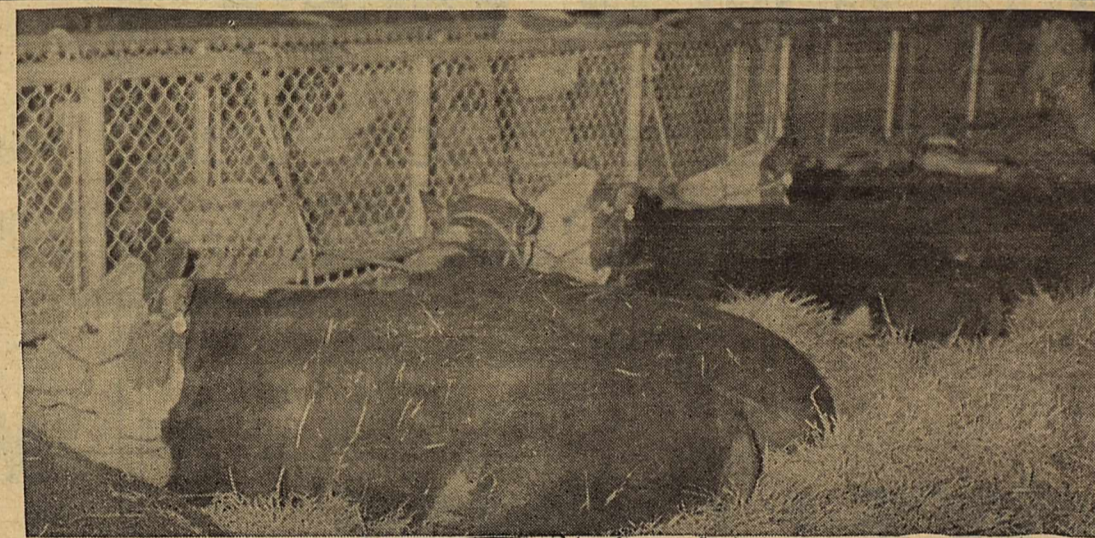
