Burleson Makes Perfect Record For Attendance

Washington, D.C. - A review of the record of the First Session of the 88th Congress that adjourned in December, shows Congressman Omar Burleson, 17th District of Texas, to be one of only 15 members of the House with a perfect attendance record on recorded votes. He was one of an even smaller group who did not miss a quorum call during the Session.

There were 119 recorded votes during the Session and Burleson was present and is on record with a "yea" or "nay on each. There were 137 quorum calls, and he was present in every instance.

Of the 435 members of the House, the average voted on 84 per cent of the roll calls.
