COMPLETED IN '64?

\$1.5 Million in School Facilities Under Construction in the County

Education in Eastland County will be getting a boost in 1964 — to the tune of a million and a half dollars in new construction.

New classrooms for each level — elementary, secondary and junior college — as well as new gymnasiums, laboratories, administration buildings, cafeterias and vocational shops are on tap for stu-

dents with the beginning of the 1964-65 school year. Construction is underway on school facilities in Eastland, Ranger and Cisco.

At Ranger Junior College, construction is underway on an extended building program including a new gym, classroom building, administration building and a laboratory building.

Haney Construction Co. was low bidder on the Ranger project with a bid of \$25,948, and completion date is set for the first week in August, 1964.

The Ranger gym room roof will feature the largest laminated wood arches ever made in this country, it is reported.

The Eastland project includes a new elementary building, a new gymnasium and a vocational shop. The \$525,000 bond election voted to finance the construction was held in February of 1963. The job is due to be completed by August 1st, but contractors say they are ahead of schedule and look for a July 15th completion.

Kinard and Beck of Abilene has contract for the Eastland job.

The \$700,000 Cisco job includes building a new high school plant, and remodeling of the present junior high building and ward school. Completion date for the pro-

ject is "hoped" for Sept. 1st, 1964, it is reported.

The original Cisco plans called for 15 general classrooms, in addition to a physics-chemistry lab, biology lab, homemaking department, library, junior high science room, vocational agriculture shop and classroom, distributive education class room and bank hall. There will also be a cafeteria and dining room adjoining a 500-seat gymnasium, as well as a 500-seat auditorium.

The Cisco facilities, the Eastland elementary building and the administration building for the Ranger college, are all to be air conditioned.

The Cisco and Ranger projects will also feature covered walkways.

Education did well in 1963 too. A \$165,000 science building and a \$160,000 boys' dormitory were dedicated at Cisco Junior College in the year just ending.

The 16-classroom elementary building in Eastland will also contain a combination auditorium and cafeteria, and will replace the two present

County Native Buried In Final Services Monday

Funeral for Lt. Col. James S. Stone, USAF retired, Eastland County native, son of Mr. Overton Stone of Carbon and brother to Mrs. J. C. Poe of Eastland, was held Monday in Mosses Lake.

Burial was also in Mosses Lake, where Col. Stone died Friday, Jan. 3rd.

Born April 21, 1923 in Carbon, he was a member of the First Baptist Church in Carbon. A Carbon High School graduate, he attended Ranger Junior College briefly before enlisting in the Air Force in May, 1942. He received his pilot training at Marfa AFB, Tex., in 1943 and later duty assignments included tours in Newfoundland, Tripoli and South Africa. He also participated in numerous assignments in Europe, Korea, Japan and bases throughout the United States.

A command pilot, he held several citations and commendations, and was retired from the Air Force Aug. 31, 1963 at Fairchild AFB, Wash.

Col. Stone was married Sept. 10, 1945.

He is survived by his wife, Katherine; four sons, James Williams, Kenneth Alan, Erie Overton and Michael Lee; his father of Carbon; two sisters, Mrs. Poe of Eastland and Mrs. Thomas F. Ireland of Lubbock.

Plans Underway For Annual Fat Stock Show

FORT WORTH — W. R. Watt, president-manager of the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show, is continuing with the successful combined producer arrangement pioneered with the 1963 Fort Worth Stock Show Rodeo.

Tommy Steiner-Hoss Inman and Associates will produce the 1964 Fort Worth Rodeo. The four producers represented in Steiner-Inman and Associates had a total of 51 animals selected for the National Finals Rodeo at Los Angeles in November. Contestants at the National Finals, the World Series of professional rodeo, select all the bucking stock to be used in the rodeo.

Headlining the 1964 rodeo stock at Fort Worth will be six Canadian bucking horses recently purchased by Steiner. The horses, now located at Steiner's X-S Bucking Stock Ranch near Austin, will make their first United States Arena appearance at the Fort Worth Rodeo.

Canadian Gus Godfriedson, previous owner of the sextet, says the horses made quite a reputation for throwing respected Canadian cowboys not just once, but as much as three or four times a day.

The horses to look for at the Fort Worth Rodeo are: Rattlesnake, War Cloud, Scrap Iron, Firefly, Lookout and Skimiken John. Godfriedson, who is part Indian, explained Skimiken John means "over the hill" in Indian lingo. The horse got the name from always being "over the hill" at round-up time.

Work In Private Homes Covered By SS System

"Many people do not know that people who work in private homes have the same protection under the social security system as workers in commerce and industry," R. R. Tuley, Jr., district manager of social security in Abilene, said today. "I get about 25 to 50 inquiries a month on this subject alone." Tuley said. "Everyone should know about this aspect of social security, because people who have covered workers in their homes are legally responsible for reporting their wages and paying the social security tax."

Wages paid to domestic workers must be reported if the cash wages paid in a calendar quarter amount to \$50 or more. As little as \$4 a week, paid regularly, Tuley said, would amount to more than \$50 in a calendar quarter. Reports are filed quarterly, and the Internal Revenue Service provides a special simplified report form for the use of the housewife or home owner in making these reports.

"Any household worker who has a question about whether he or she is covered by social security should get in touch with the local office of the Social Security Administration. Employers who need information about reporting their employees can secure information from the Social Security Administration or the Internal Revenue Service," Tuley added. "The thing to remember is that these reports must be made, or you may be called on later to pay the back taxes. If there's any doubt as to whether you have to report or not, get in touch with our office. We'll be glad to help you."

Bell Telephone Seeks Higher Ranger Rates

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company has filed a request for higher rates in Ranger.

Bill Boothe, manager of the company, said that "Continued inadequate earnings on our operations here leave us no choice but to ask for an increase in local rates."

Present basic rates were established here in 1960, at the time dial telephones were placed in service. These rates were the result of a request filed in June, 1956, and were based on a study of operating results and economic conditions during 1955, the telephone manager said.

"Since that time, the continuing high costs of furnishing telephone service in Ranger has resulted in unsatisfactory earnings on our operations here," Boothe declared.

"Present rates, based on 1955 operations, are too low to meet today's cost of doing business and provide a fair return on the fair value of our property here."

"The company has done all it can to keep expenses here as low as possible. The only solution is a reasonable increase in rates, in keeping with today's higher costs. We hope our request will receive prompt and favorable action," he said.

Conservation Plans for Farms SCS Reviewing

Soil Conservation Service
personnel are busy this month
reviewing conservation plans
with farmers and ranchers in
Eastland County, according to
E. E. McAllister, manager of
the Eastland County office of
the Soil Conservation Service.
This annual review is a part
of the assistance available to
operators who have signed a
Program contract.

Progress in applying a con-
servation plan as well as prac-
tices scheduled for the coming
year are reviewed. As a part
of this review, the operator an-
alyzes his forage resources for
the coming year. Using
the land within its capabilities
and treating it for maintain-
ance and improvement is the
goal of most of the farmers and
ranchers.

Some 100 acres of cropland
has been changed to pasture in
1963 and approximately 500
acres of rangeland seeded un-
der these Great Plains Con-
tracts in Eastland County. A

balance of seeding and hay re-
sources with cash crops, such
as peanuts, will have a stabi-
lizing effect upon the agricul-
tural enterprises.

Current investment in Con-
servation will pay dividends in
the future. The Agricultural
Great Plains Conservation
Program are set up as a way
the American people can have
a stake in the future, through
a shaving of cost in applica-
tion of conservation practices.

It is not always easy for the
farmer to pay his share and
make adjustment in his opera-
tors to apply a conservation
program. In many cases re-
duced income for a few years
is necessary in getting a unit
stabilized for continuing op-
erators.

The way farmers and ranch-
ers manage and operate today
will determine if there will
be food and clothing available
in the future.

Abstracting Firm Adds Time-Saving Machine

Veteran county abstracting firm, The Earl Bender Co., has recently installed modern electronic equipment that cuts in half the time required

in operation for about four weeks. Over 80 pages a day can be recorded by one operator where as only 40 could be done by a typist, typing all day.

The new machine came from New York and is leased. Mrs. June Tankersley and Mrs. Doris Kent, operators, are very pleased with the machine.

There are five basic steps to operating the machine, and Pat Miller says it will improve the efficiency of the office's recording work in the court house.

The machine is a dry chemical camera that takes the picture, size for size of the document. The plates can be reused many times. Mistakes are very few when it is copied directly from the instrument file books.

In comparing the machine the one in the County Clerks office, it is much smaller and compact. The one in the County Clerks office has water piped to it and a separate drain pipe.

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — I hear that dependent parents compensation was recently raised but I am still receiving \$75 because of my son's death in World War II. When does this raise become effective?

A — The increase, effective last July, applied to Dependency and Indemnity Compensation only. The older "death compensation" is paid for service-connected deaths occurring before 1957. You may change to the new Dependency and Indemnity Compensation if you wish but this will be advantageous only if your income from all other sources is not over \$750 a year. The graduated rates of the newer law may pay less than your present compensation.
