At Ranger Junior College, construction is underway on an extended building program including a new gym, classroom building, administration building and a laboratory building.

Haney Construction Co. was low bidder on the Ranger project with a bid of \$25,-948, and completion date is set for the first week in August, 1964.

The Ranger gym room roof will feature the largest laminated wood arches ever made in this country, it is reported.

The Eastland project includes a new elementary building, a new gymnasium and a vocational shop. The \$525,000 bond election voted to finance the construction was held in February of 1963. The job is due to be completed by Aug. 1st, but contractors say they are ahead of schedule and look for a July 15th completion.

Funeral for Lt. Col. James S. Stone, USAF retired, Eastland County native, son of Mr. Overton Stone of Carbon and brother to Mrs. J. C. Poe of Eastland, was held Monday in Mosses Law Wash,

Burial was also in Mosses Lake, where Col. Stone died Friday, Jan. 3rd.

Born April 21, 1923 in Car-bon, he was a member of the First Baptist Church in Carbon. A Carbon High School graduate, he attended Ranger Junior College briefly before enlisting in the Air Force in May, 1942. He received his pilot training at Marfa AFB, Tex., in 1943 and later duty assignments included tours in Newfoundland, Tripoli and South Africa. He also participated in numerous assignments in Europe, Korea, Japan and bases throughout the United States

A command pilot, he held several citations a n d commendations, and was retired from the Air Force Aug. 31, 1963 at Fairchild AFB, Wash.

Col. Stone was married Sept. 10, 1945.

FORT WORTH - W. R. Watt, president-manager of the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show, is c o n tinuing with the successful combined producer arrange ment pioneered with the 1963 Fort Worth Stock Show Ro-

Tommy Steiner-Hoss Inman and Associates will produce the 1964 Fort Worth Rodeo. The four producers represented in Steiner-Inman and Associates had a total of 51 animals selected for the National Finals Rodeo at Los Angeles in November. Contestants at the National Finals, the World Series of professional rodeo, select all the bucking stock to be used in the rodeo.

Headlining the 1964 rodeo stock at Fort Worth will be six Canadian bucking horses recently purchased by Stein-er. The horses, now located at Steiner's X-S Bucking Stock Ranch near Austin, will make their first United States Arena appearance at the Fort Worth.

Canadian Gus Godfriedson, previous owner of the sextet, says the horses made quite a reputation for throwing respected Canadian cowboys not just once, but as much as three or four times a day.

The horses to look for at the Fort Worth Rodeo are: Rattlesnake, War Cloud, Scrap Iron, Firefly, Lookout and Skimiken John. Godfriedson, who is part Indian, explained Skimiken John means "over the hill" in Indian lingo. The horse got the name from always being "over the hill" at round-up time.

Work In Private **Homes Covered** By SS System

"Many people do not know that people who work in private homes have the same protection under the social security system as workers in commerce and industry," R. R. Tuley, Jr., district manager of social security in Abilene, said today. "I get about 25 to 50 inquiries a month on this subject alone." Tulley said. "Everyone should know about this aspect of social security, because people who have covered workers in their homes are legally responsible for reporting their wages and paying the social security

Wages paid to domestic workers must be reported if the cash wages paid in a calendar quarter amount to \$50 or more. As little as \$4 a week, paid regularly, Tuley said, would amount to more than \$50 in a calendar quarter. Reports are filed quarterly, and the Internal Revenue Service provides a special simplified report form for the use of the housewife or home owner in making these reports.

"Any household worker who has a question about whether he or she is covered by social security should get in touch with the local office of the So-cial Security Administration. Employers who need information about reporting their employees can secure information from the Social Security Administration or the Internal Revenue Service," Tuley added. "The thing to remember is that these reports must be made, or you may be called on later to pay the back taxes. Bell Telephone Seeks Higher Ranger Rates

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company has filed a request for higher rates in Ranger.

Bill Boothe, manager of the company, said that "Contin-ued inadequate earnings on our operations here leave us no choice but to ask for an increase in local rates."

Present basic rates were established here in 1960, at the time dial telephones were placed in service. These rates were the result of a request filed in June, 1956, and were based on a study of operating results and economic conditions during 1955, the telephone manager said.

"Since that time, the continuing high costs of furnishing telephone service in Ranger has resulted in unsatisfactory earnings on our opera-tions here," Boothe declared.

"Present rates, based on 1955 operations, are too low to meet today's cost of doing business and provide a fair return on the fair value of our property here.

"The company has done all it can to keep expenses here as low as possible. The only solution is a reasonable increase in rates, in keeping with today's higher costs. We hope our request will receive prompt and favorable action," he said.

Conservation

Plans for Farms SCS Reviewing

S o i l Concervation Service personnel are busy this month reviewing conservation plans with farmers and ranchers in Eastland County, according to E. E. McAllister, manager of the Eastland County office of the Soil Conservation Service. This annual review is a part of the assistance available to operators who have signed a Program contract.

Progress in applying a conservation plan as well as practices scheduled for the coming year are reviewed. As a part of this review, the operator analyzes his forage resources for the coming year. Using the land within its capabilities and treating it for maintainance and improvement is the goal of most of the farmers and ranchers.

Some 100 acres of cropland has been changed to pasture in 1963 and approximately 500 acres of rangeland seeded under these Great Plains contracts in Eastland County. A

balance or graping and hay resources with cash crops, such as peanuts, will have a stabilizing effect upon the agricultural enterprises.

Current investment in Conservation will pay dividends in the future. The Agricultural Great Plains Conservation Program are set up as a way the American people can have a stake in the future, through a shaving of cost in application of conservation practices.
