New County Budget Calls For \$430,850 During Coming Year

A budget calling for disbursements of approximately \$430,850.00 during the 1963-64 fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1, has been given tentative approval by the Eastland County Commissioners' Court, according to a report Friday.

The new budget anticipates receipts of about \$400,000.00. For comparison, the county had \$414,709.00 in expenses during the fiscal year that ends this month and receipts were expected to total about \$385,375.00.

The county will continue to be among the 5 counties of the state with lowest tax rates as the '63-64 budget is based on collecting 30 cents per \$100 valuation, the report said. The 50 cent rate provides 5 cents for the jury fund, 10 cents for the sinking fund, 60 cents for the genera fund, and 5 cents for the road and bridge fund.

During the last five-year period, total collections were 92 per cent, the lowest being 91.9 in 1959.

Assessed valuations for next year are \$21,871,540 and were approximately the same last year.

County-wide indebtedness as of January 1, 1964 will be \$41,-

School Savings Stamps On Sale

Savings Bond sales in Eastland County during the month of August totaled \$20,656, according to Guy Parker, Chairman of the Eastland County Savings Bonds Committee.

Savings Bond sales in Texos for the filst aight months of 1963 totaled \$99,644.534, which represents 66.2 percent of the state goal.

"The 1963-64 School Savings Stamp Program is again in full swing. This has been an important feature of the bond program since 1941. All children buying their first U. S. Savings Stamp this fall—whether at school or at the post office—will receive certificates signed by the seven Mercury astronauts, making them "Junior Astronauts," Chairman Parker announced.






