It is with this in mind that '----- is recommended for adult entertainment only. "

A growing number of newspapers is refusing to accept advertising of this nature. The reason is simple. It's misleading. The Clauses recommending the entertainment for adults is a direct appeal to children.

## Court Action Is Now Filed **Against Both**

A cross petition charging that Lea County Electric Cooperative is operating illegally has been filed in district court by the City of Plains.

Filing of the cross action is the latest move in the present dispute between the two corporations which are supplying electric power to Plains residents.

Court action began last week when Lea County filed an application for an injunction against the city. Purpose of the injunction was to force the city to lower rates for power.

The action stemmed from previous requests by Lea County to have power rates lowered.

The co-op, which serves about 25 per cent of the city population, has sought permission of the City Council to lower city rates. Lea County claims it is seeking to establish the same rates here that it has in Tatum and Lovington.

But city officials claim that present rates are the same as those recommended by Lea County several years ago. In an answer filed by the city,

the City of Plains claimed that it has the sole and exclusive right, power and authority to set and establish the rates to be charged for electric energy and that the court has no jurisdiction to interfere with this regulating power.

The city further claimed that Lea County is attempting to regulate electric rates by judicial decree, rather than through governmental agencies as prescribed by statute.

## County Votes Tower Again

Yoakum County voters gave shaky 405-376 endorsement to successful Republican Candidate John Tower in Saturday's special senate runoff election.

Tower's margin of victory came from the Denver City area as Plains voters favored Democrat William Blakley, 130-131.

A total of 781 votes, nearly 200 under the number cast in the first election, were marked by county citizens. Neither Republican candidate ran side put forth much effort locally.

Endorsement of Tower in Yoakum County put this area in a somewhat perculiar position in that it has favored Republican candidates in each of the past three elections. Tower led the first senate race Patsy Winkles here and Richard Nixon edged President Kennedy in November's presidential election.

In Saturday's balloting, neither candidate cleaned up in any voting area. Most boxes showed the vote pretty even. One box, No. 8, gave Blakley 38 votes and Tower 37.

As for the four boxes in Plains, Blakley carried three of them, while Tower held a narrow edge in the other. No. 1 gave 42 votes to Blakley and 27 to Tower. In No. 2 it was 21 for Blakley and 13 for Tower. No. 3 voters gave Blakley a 47-35 edge, but voters of No. 4 favored Tower 26-20.

Denver City's three boxes, Nos. 7, 8 and 9, gave Tower a 279-206 advantage. The strongest in No. 7 (133-94) and and No. 9 (109-74). Rural boxes, Nos. 5 and 6, both favored Blakley, 18-6 and 20-7, respectively. Of 14 absentee votes cast, 12 went to Tower.

the city is charging that Lea County not only is operating without a permit but was never legally entitled to a franchise here in the first place since electric power was available from a private company.

The city claims that Lea County was granted a permit July 12, 1950, but this permit expired last July and has not been renewed.

In its cross action, the city says that Lea County is operating in violation of the statutes and laws of the state and that the city is entitled to a judgment decreeing that Lea County is not a legal corporation within the state, and is illegally using and occupying the streets and alleys of the city and is illegally selling electric energy to inhabitants of the city.

Therefore, the city seeks an injunction enjoining the co-op from doing business in the City of Plains and an order requiring the co-op to remove its poles, lines and other fixtures from the streets and alleys.






